Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to modify the contract with Burgess & Niple, Inc. for additional services to prepare plans, specifications, bidding documents and VAP documentation for the remediation of the contaminated soil at Saunders Park. It will be more time efficient and cost effective to keep the current engineering team in place, so that we can move forward as quickly as possible.

Burgess and Niple, Inc. was originally contracted by the City in 2013, Ordinance 2128-2013, contract amount of \$142,000.00 for services to prepare plans, specifications, bidding does and VAP reporting/documentation for the remediation of the soils in Saunders Park. A second modification to that contract took place in Oct. 2014, Ordinance No. 2343-2014; contract amount of \$289,000.00. This allowed for additional services to be added including engineering, project oversight/management, OEPA coordination and additional VAP reporting and documentation. In an effort to keep the project moving forward, Burgess and Niple, Inc. expanded their scope of services to provide additional design, bid package material, engineering services during construction, providing information for the City Attorney's Office for OEPA, Hexion and USEPA and No Further Action review information.

The modification will increase the current cost of the project of \$451,000.00 by adding \$80,000.00 for a new project total of \$531,000.00.

This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to modify the contract with Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. for the purpose of providing a biosolids beneficial reuse program called Deep Row Hybrid Poplar (DRHP) program for the Division of Sewerage and Drainage (DOSD).

This contract modification No. 6 is for the continuation of the DRHP program on the 1,012 acre New Lexington Tree Farm, LLC (NLTF), located in Perry Township, Perry County, Ohio, and owned by Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. under Plan-C detailed below.

This contract originally authorized Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. to remove a minimum of 27,000 and up to a maximum of 30,000 wet tons of biosolids annually from the DOSD's Wastewater Treatment Facilities (WWTFs) and reuse the biosolids in their DRHP program. With modification No. 3 Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. was authorized to remove 0-30,000 wet tons annually at an increased rate of \$40.00 per wet ton, and for volumes of 30,001 or more wet tons annually at a reduced rate of \$35.00 per wet ton. All biosolids removed from the WWTFs will be Class B dewatered biosolids, originating from both Southerly and Jackson Pike Wastewater Treatment Plants. The biosolids will be utilized as a nitrogen source to grow hybrid poplar trees which will later be harvested for mulch. In addition, the biosolids will add valuable organic material to the old abandoned mine site that is now repurposed as the New Lexington Tree Farm. Approximately 30 acres will be utilized per year at the New Lexington Tree Farm site with trees being harvested every 6 to 8 years.

The Director of Public Utilities received the Ohio Mulch, Inc. proposal on April 15, 2011 in response to the DOSD Request for Proposals for Innovative Reuse of Biosolids and it was the only proposal received with the DRHP concept. Other proposals received included three mechanized dryer processes that would dry and pelletize biosolids for commercial wholesale and two biosolids-cake land application proposals. Of all proposals submitted under the Innovative Reuse of Biosolids RFP, the selection committee deemed the DRHP as the best fit for the DOSD Biosolids Program.

The terms for the award contract and modification No. 6 are as follows:

- 1. Award contract was for approximately 6 months at \$35 per wet ton and authorized Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. to remove up to 15,000 wet tons of Class B biosolids.
- 2. Modification No. 1 extended the contract an additional 12 months at \$35 per wet ton and authorized Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. to remove up to 30,000 wet tons of Class B biosolids.
- 3. Modification No. 2 extended the contract an additional 12 months at \$35 per wet ton and authorized Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. to remove up to 30,000 wet tons of Class B biosolids.

At the end of contract modification No. 2, 30 months would have elapsed from the contract and the DOSD and Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. were to choose to continue this contract by modification(s) according to Plan-A or Plan-B as follows:

Plan-A: accounting for the award contract and all modifications, Plan-A's total contract duration is 5 years:

4. Modification No. 3 will extend the contract 18 months at \$35 per wet ton and authorizes Ohio Mulch Supply, Inc. to remove up to 45,000 wet tons of Class B biosolids.

The Department of Public Utilities is responsible for the daily administration, operation and maintenance of the City of Columbus water supply and distribution system including three (3) water treatment plants; sanitary and storm water collection and treatment system including two (2) waste water treatment plants and a bio-solids composting facility; and electricity power distribution including numerous power substations and transformers. DPU operations are subject to multiple environmental permits which include two (2) Title V permits, numerous state air permits, six (6) National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits, and general storm water permits. Additionally, DPU administers the pretreatment and storm water regulatory programs (MS4)

Permit Program) for the City of Columbus. These extensive operations and regulatory requirements support the need for a robust EMS program.

Alcohol Monitoring Systems holds many patents on the continuous alcohol monitoring device and Fairfield Information Services is the only local vendor authorized to providing monitoring services.

The continued use of the SCRAM devices necessitates monitoring services, which are provided by ACS. The devices were purchased from Alcohol Monitoring Services and they have named ACS as a sole provider of monitoring service. As a consequence, this is a sole source provider under section 329.19 (e) of the City Code.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funds are available within the 2018 Electronic Alcohol Monitoring (IDIAM) fund for this purpose.

To amend Section 3902.03 of the Columbus City Code to update and further establish the structure of the Mayor's Office of Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Council.

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus has established an Office of Diversity and Inclusion within the Office of the Mayor that is responsible for the implementation and administration of the policies and programs set forth in

Title 39 of the Columbus City Code; and

WHEREAS, Title 39 of the Columbus City Code establishes the organization of the Mayor's Office of Diversity and Inclusion; and

WHEREAS, the organization of the Mayor's Office of Diversity and Inclusion includes an Advisory Council; and

WHEREAS, to establish and effectively administer the Advisory Council updates to the Council structure are required; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That Section 3902.03 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended reading as follows:

3902.03 - Advisory Council.

There is hereby created and established the Mayor's Office of Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Council. This advisory council shall provide guidance, review and recommendations for modification of ODI programs. The ODI Advisory Council may be comprised of up to nine seven members and shall may be made up of the following:

- (A) The ODI director, or its designee, shall serve as an ex-officio be a non-voting member;
- (B) A member of city council, or designee, appointed by city council, shall serve as an ex-officio non-voting member The procurement manager, or designee, within the department of finance;
- (C) The procurement manager, or designee, within the department of finance and management Up to three appointed minority owned and/or women owned business representatives; or
- (D) Up to six (6) members of the publicthree appointed community representatives with an understanding of supplier and workforce diversity.
- (E) A city council member, appointed by city council, or a representative designated by that appointed city council member, to serve as a non-voting ex-officio member of this Advisory Council.

The Advisory Council shall elect one of its members (with the exception of the ODI director) to be the chairperson. All members, unless otherwise provided, will be appointed by the mayor with the concurrence of city council, shall serve without compensation, and may be removed by the mayor without cause at any time. Those appointed in accordance with division (D) shall serve a term of two (2) years.

None of the minority or women members may vote on or otherwise participate in advisory matters that directly or indirectly involve their individual firms, with the exception that they may participate in and vote on policy matters that affect the broad class of M/WBEs.

SECTION 2. That existing Section 3902.03 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BACKGROUND: The City of Columbus health statistics show an increase in disease associated with obesity and a sedentary lifestyle. To encourage healthy and active living, Columbus Public Health has budgeted \$20,000.00 in the Health Special Revenue Fund for making grants to non-profit organizations for community gardening projects. City Council wishes to support this project and has made available in the Neighborhood Initiatives Fund an additional \$10,000.00.

The purpose of this ordinance is to appropriate funds in the Neighborhood Initiatives Fund, authorize the expenditure from the Health Special Revenue Operating Fund and Neighborhood Initiatives Fund and to authorize the payment of \$30,000.00 to The Columbus Foundation, Foundation for Active Living for the management of the 2018 Community Gardening Project.

The Community Garden Initiative supports the city's effort to build a fair and sustainable food system. As one part of the Local Food Action Plan, gardens also improve access and education related to healthy, affordable, local food. Since 2010, Columbus City Council has supported 222 gardens with funding of \$141,280. In 2017, a record 36 gardens including 8 new ones were supported by more than 700 volunteers. In addition, 17 of the gardens were able to secure additional funding from other sources as a result of having received this grant.

The Foundation for Active Living is a donor-advised fund that was established by the Columbus Board of Health with The Columbus Foundation in 2008 under the authority of Ordinance No. 1210-2008, approved by City Council on July 14, 2008. Ordinance No. 0493-2011, approved by City Council on April 4, 2011, amended the agreement with The Columbus Foundation by authorizing The Columbus Foundation, Foundation for Active Living to accept funds from the city.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency so as to allow this appropriation and the expenditure to be received by The Columbus Foundation, Foundation for Active Living as soon as possible for the development of community gardens.

BACKGROUND: This legislation is for the option to establish a Universal Term Contract (UTC) for Armored Car Services. The City Treasurer oversees the use of this contract by multiple agencies to transfer cash and checks both between the Treasurer's Office and to banking institutions. The term of the proposed option contract would be approximately three years, expiring March 31, 2021, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year periods. The Purchasing Office opened formal proposals on November 16, 2017.

The Purchasing Office advertised and solicited proposals in accordance with the relevant provisions of Section 329 relating to Requests for Proposals (RFQ007202). One response was received.

An evaluation committee consisting of one representative from Recreation and Parks, one from Office of Diversity and Inclusion, one from Treasurer's Office, one from Parking Violations and one from Municipal Courts scored the written proposal submitted by the offeror. Ordinance number 1300-2017, approved by City Council on June 5, 2017, authorized the Board of Health to enter into a contract with Equitas Health, in the amount of \$50,000.00 for a period through March 31, 2018, to continue a partnership with Columbus Public Health for a harm reduction program, called Safe Point. Part of this effort includes making Naloxone readily available to heroin and opiate users in order to save lives.

This ordinance is needed to modify by increasing and extending contract PO090908 in the amount of \$12,500.00 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$62,500.00, for a time period ending June 30, 2018 with Equitas Health. This modification is needed to continue a harm reduction program to provide Naloxone to opiate users.

Harm reduction services provided by Equitas Health allow clients who are at high-risk of accidental overdose death to access the lifesaving drug, Naloxone. During the first 9 months of 2017, 1,152 lives were known to have been saved from Naloxone that was acquired at the Safe Point program. During Q1, Q2, and Q3 of 2017, 1,051 individual clients were given access to an alcohol and drug consultation, 697 were linked to medical care, and 351 were linked to behavioral or mental healthcare services.

Emergency action is requested for this contract modification in order to ensure Columbus has a harm reduction program to continue to save lives.

FISCAL IMPACT: The funds needed to modify this contract with Equitas Health are budgeted within the Health Department Special Revenue Fund;

To authorize and direct the Board of Health to modify, by increasing and extending, an existing contract with Equitas Health to continue to provide a harm reduction program, called Safe Point, through June 30, 2018; and to declare an emergency. (\$12,500.00)

BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes an agreement with the Ohio Traffic Safety Office (OTSO), State of Ohio, for the FFY 2018 Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Regional Coordinators Grant, and to appropriate funds to cover the costs of the program. A drug recognition expert or drug recognition evaluator (DRE) is a police officer trained to recognize impairment in drivers under the influence of drugs other than, or in addition to, alcohol. In the Spring of 2017, the State of Ohio appointed (5) DRE Regional Coordinators assigned to oversee DRE call-out activities and reporting, and to provide expert witness testimony, DRE training, DRE recertification classes, and DRE recertification audits for their assigned regions, as well as attend OTSO DRE meetings and the annual International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) conference on Drugs, Alcohol, and Impaired Driving. The State of Ohio recognized the need to minimize the fiscal burden to law enforcement agencies covering costs for a state-appointed DRE Regional Coordinator. So, this initial 2018 pilot grant is awarded to the City of Columbus Division of Police to cover up to 500 overtime hours and costs associated with the State of Ohio Region 6 DRE Regional Coordinator state-assigned duties. Region 6 covers all DREs in Franklin, Licking, Fairfield, Pickaway, Madison, Delaware, and Morrow counties.

This grant agreement authorizes reimbursement for overtime, supplies, and travel and training costs necessary to meet the following grant goals: 1. Review and approve all Drug Evaluations in the assigned region, 2. Schedule and teach (2) ARIDE classes, 3. Develop and teach (1) DRE recertification class. The funding for the agreement is dependent on federal funds from the US Department of Transportation for Federal Fiscal Year 2018 and follows the fiscal year period, October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018. The grant award effective period is January 1, 2018 until September 30, 2018.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: Emergency legislation is necessary to make funds available for the grant funded activity period that started January 1, 2018.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes the appropriation of \$54,793.44 from the unappropriated balance of the General Government Grant Fund for the Division of Police to cover the costs associated with the FFY 2018 Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Regional Coordinators Grant. The total of Modification No. 1, no inspection: \$200,000.00 (This Ordinance)

The contract amount including all modifications: \$1,650,000.00

The amount of construction administration and inspection services for this modification will be \$20,000.00. The total legislated amount for construction administration and inspection services for this contract is increasing from \$217,500.00 to \$237,500.00.

Searches in the System for Award Management (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against Complete General Construction Company.

2. WAIVER OF COMPETITIVE BIDDING

A waiver of competitive bidding is requested to allow electrical items to be added to the Bridge Rehabilitation - Annual Citywide Contract (2017). The bridges on the original bid list for the Bridge Rehabilitation - Annual Citywide Contract (2017) did not need electrical work so electrical bid items were not included in the original contract. There is now a need to complete electrical work sooner than originally planned for the Broad Street Bridge, requiring this bridge to be added to the contract so the work can be completed per the new construction schedule.

3. UNPLANNED MODIFICATION

This is an unplanned modification that is necessary to add the scope of work to perform a lighting upgrade to the Broad Street Bridge and to cover the cost of work needed for that lighting upgrade project. This cost for the additional scope of work exceeded the project's contingency amount. It was deemed to be more cost efficient to modify the existing contract than to bid this part of the work.

In 2017, the City of Columbus negotiated Memorandum of Understanding #2017-02 between the Columbus Board of Health and the Ohio Council 8, AFSCME Local 2191, Ohio Council 8, AFSCME Local 1632 and CWA to provide funding for the Ohio AFSCME Care Plan. This plan provides a hearing aid benefit for these employees. Per this agreement, payments are to be made annually on June 1st and December 1st. The payment is \$3.00 per covered employee. The city assumes no other role in this plan. The first payment was made in December 2017, and was funded through the administrative sub fund of the Employee Benefits Trust Fund; the more appropriate subfund is the medical subfund. At that time, however, the cost for this new coverage was not known and therefore, not budgeted in the medical subfund. At this time, it is necessary to appropriate \$25,000 from the unappropriated balance of the Employee Benefits Trust Fund, medical subfund, to allow the Department of Human Resources to pay costs associated with both the June, 2018 and December, 2018 payments for the provision of hearing aid insurance.

Fiscal Impact: Funds are currently available and budgeted in the Employee Benefits Trust Fund, medical subfund. This ordinance appropriates the funds and allows payments to be made on June 1, 2018 and December 1, 2018, per the negotiated agreement.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: The Affordable Housing Trust for Columbus and Franklin County (Housing Trust) combines public and private funding through a variety of sources to support the development of housing within

the City. Both rental units and homeownership projects are developed.

In 2018 the City will commit its annual contribution of the hotel/motel tax receipts to the Housing Trust at an estimated \$1,822,000 or whatever greater or lesser sum of money may be received through the portion of the Hotel/Motel Excise Tax fund allocated to the Housing Trust. The amount is based on 0.43% in relation to the 5.1% total city rate.

This legislation authorizes a contract with the Housing Trust and directs the expenditure of funds.

This legislation is presented as an emergency because of the need to continue program services without interruption.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation authorizes and directs the expenditure of 0.43% of the combined rates of 5.1% of the Hotel/Motel Excise Tax fund, presently estimated at \$1,822,000, and authorizes an agreement with the Housing Trust.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a contract with the Affordable Housing Trust for Columbus and Franklin County to facilitate the production of affordable housing and enhance home ownership opportunities in Columbus; to authorize the expenditure of 0.43% (presently estimated at \$1,822,000.00) of the combined rates of 5.1% of the Hotel/Motel Excise Tax; and to declare an emergency. The City of Columbus in partnership with The Ohio State University Medical Center and the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority has substantial interest in and are committed to the vision of enhancing the quality of life on the near east side of Columbus by creating a healthy, financially and environmentally sustainable, community where residents have access to safe and affordable housing, quality healthcare, educational and employment opportunities.

The parties have agreed to work together in order to facilitate that vision: the Partners Achieving Community Transformation (PACT). The principal goal of PACT is to develop a community master plan through the services of a master planning entity and aided by the input of the PACT governance structure, advisory committee and sub-committees.

The Blueprint for Community Investment was the resulting transformation plan for the Near East side as is currently being implemented by PACT and it's member organizations: The City of Columbus (City), Columbus

Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) and The Ohio State University (OSU).

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with Partners Achieving Community Transformation for the commitment of an annual sum of \$250,000 for a period of five years. 2018 represents the third year of the five year commitment.

Emergency action is requested to allow Partners Achieving Community Transformation to commence work outlined in the MOU for the creation of a healthy, financially and environmentally sustainable community.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In 2014, the Director of Public Utilities entered into a contract with Oracle Elevator Company for Elevator Maintenance Services, Facilities Equipment Maintenance Project #1401.3 for the Division of Sewerage and Drainage. The Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant, Jackson Pike Wastewater Treatment Plant and Sewer Maintenance Operation Center have various styles of elevators that need to be inspected, maintained and repaired on a routine and emergency basis. The work to be performed under this contract will be mainly Elevators and their associated equipment and systems that require inspection, testing, troubleshooting, maintenance, and repair or replacement of failed components. The work may also include updating of software for the various units and their associated equipment.

The Department of Public Utilities advertised and solicited competitive bids in accordance with Chapter 329 of the City Code (Solicitation SA005332). Twenty-six (26) bids were solicited (2 MBR, 2 M1A, 22 MAJ), and three (3) bids (3 MAJ) were received and opened on March 26, 2014. The apparent low bidder, Fujitec America Inc., had requested to withdraw their bid in accordance with CMSC paragraph 102.13, within the specified 48 hours. This request was due to the vendor incorrectly summarizing their pricing on a monthly rather than a yearly basis. It would present an extreme hardship on the company to honor these prices.

After review of the bids, it was determined that Kone Inc. was non-responsive due to adding contract provisions not provided in the documents. The Division of Sewerage and Drainage then recommended an award be made to the lowest, responsive and responsible bidder Oracle Elevator Company.

The original contract was for a period of one year with three (3) one year renewal options on a year to year basis upon mutual agreement, availability of funding and Columbus City Council approval. The Division of Sewerage and Drainage utilized its third extension option in Ordinance 1431-2017 (Mod. 3), which extended the term of the contract through September 14, 2018. This modification (Mod. 4) authorizes the expenditure of an additional \$70,000.00 without extending the term of the contract.

Although the vendor's original bid document used the name Oracle Elevator Company this ordinance is being written to utilize the complete name of Abell Elevator Service Company dba Oracle Elevator Company. This is the name as registered with the Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service, and as registered with the City of Columbus, Vendor Services. The same FID number is utilized as has been in the past.

BACKGROUND: The City established the Stelzer-Stygler Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) in 1986 to stimulate private investment and job creation. In 1994, changes in the CRA law placed additional obligations on municipalities to compensate school districts for lost revenues arising from tax abatements. In May 2002, the City entered into a Compensation Agreement with the Gahanna-Jefferson School District to compensate the District for revenues from real property taxes forgone due to abatements on parcels in the Stelzer-Stygler CRA.

The present legislation authorizes the payment of \$225,896.26 to the Gahanna-Jefferson City School District as the compensation due in 2018 for tax year 2017. This sum is calculated using the definitions in the Compensation Agreement and is based on two parcels (520-250983 and 520-250987) in the Gahanna-Jefferson School District area of the Stelzer-Stygler CRA with building improvements and CRA tax abatements. The abatement for parcel 520-250983 commenced with tax year 2009 and will terminate in tax year 2018. The abatement for parcel 520-250987 commenced with tax year 2017 and will terminate in tax year 2026.

The total private investment subject to exemption in the new buildings constructed on these two parcels was approximately \$23,684,700 in 2017 and the total estimated number of new jobs created was approximately 685.

Emergency action is requested in order for the City to make the \$225,896.26 payment to the Gahanna-Jefferson City School District according to the schedule established in the Compensation Agreement.

FISCAL IMPACT: The 2018 General Fund budget (citywide account) includes funding for this payment to

the Gahanna-Jefferson School District. A transfer equal to 25 percent (25%) of the payment will be transferred from the Special Income Tax Fund.

BACKGROUND: It is necessary to appropriate \$264,891.38 from the unappropriated balance of the Special Revenue Fund, entitled the Police Continuing Professional Training Fund. This appropriation will be used by the Division of Police for officers to attend training seminars and instructor development.

In 2007, Ohio Senate Bill 281 was signed into law, thereby enacting a mandatory continuing professional training program for Ohio peace officers. These training requirements can be found in the Ohio Revised Code 109.802. Ordinance No. 0087-2008, passed on February 4, 2008, authorized the Public Safety Director to participate in the state-funded continuing professional training reimbursement program. The Division of Police complied with this mandate and has received consistent reimbursements dating back to 2008. Reimbursement for 2017 mandated hours amounted to a deposit of \$652,064.00 in 2018. State law mandates that these funds be kept in a separate account and be used only to pay the costs of Continuing Professional Training programs.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: N/A

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: Emergency legislation is requested so that the appropriation may be in place to fund immediate training needs for Police officers.

VICTORIAN VILLAGE COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The site is zoned in the ARLD, Apartment Residential District, and developed with a three-unit dwelling. The requested Council variance will permit the addition of a carriage house dwelling, while bringing the non-conforming parcel and three-unit dwelling into compliance. The variance is necessary because the ARLD, Apartment Residential District prohibits one three-unit dwelling and one single-unit dwelling on the same lot. Variances for reduced parking space width, lot width, lot area, fronting, building setback, side yards, and rear yard are included in the request. Staff supports the proposal because the request will not add incompatible uses to the area as there are other carriage houses within this neighborhood. The request is consistent with the recent development pattern in historic urban neighborhoods, and building design will conform to the Victorian Village Commission requirements.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3333.02, AR-12, ARLD and AR-1 apartment residential district use; 3312.29, Parking space; 3333.09, Area requirements; 3333.11, ARLD area district requirements; 3333.16, Fronting; 3333.18(D), Building lines; 3333.22, Maximum side yard required; 3333.23, Minimum side yard permitted; and 3333.24, Rear yard, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **82 PRICE AVENUE (43201)**, to permit a single-unit dwelling (a carriage house) on the rear of a lot developed with a three-unit dwelling with reduced development standards in the ARLD, Apartment Residential District (Council Variance # CV17-080).

WHEREAS, by application #CV17-080, the owner of the property at 82 PRICE AVENUE (43201) (43215), is requesting a Variance to permit a single-unit dwelling (a carriage house) on the rear of a lot developed with a three-unit dwelling with reduced development standards in the ARLD, Apartment Residential District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.02, AR-12, ARLD and AR-1 apartment residential district use, requires a separate lot for each principal use, while the applicant proposes to build a single-unit dwelling above a detached garage (carriage house) on the rear of a lot developed with a three-unit dwelling; and

WHEREAS, Section 3312.29, Parking space, requires a parking space to be a rectangular area not less than 9 by 18 feet, while the applicant proposes a reduced width of 8.3 feet for the 4 required parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.09, Area requirements, requires that no building shall be erected or altered on a lot with a width of less than 50 feet, while the applicant proposes to maintain the existing lot width of 36.2 feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.11, ARLD area district requirements, requires 2,500 square feet per dwelling unit on interior lots, while the applicant proposes a total of 4 dwelling units resulting in 1,359 square feet per dwelling unit on the lot; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.16, Fronting, requires each dwelling unit to have frontage on a public street, while the applicant proposes a carriage house fronting on a rear public alley; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.18(D), Building lines, requires a building line of no less than 10 feet along Price Avenue, while the applicant proposes to maintain a reduced building line of 5.9 feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3333.22, Maximum side yard required, requires that the sum of the widths of each side yard shall equal or exceed 20 percent of the width of the lot, provided that no more than 16 feet need be so devoted, while the applicant proposes to maintain a total side yard reduced from 7.25 to 6.2 feet for the existing three-unit dwelling; and

WHEREAS, City Departments recommend approval of the requested variances because the proposal will not add incompatible uses to the area as there are other carriage houses within this neighborhood. The most recent contract was authorized by ordinance 0961-2017, passed May 1, 2017 through PO062061.

The contract supports the provisions for services between the City of Columbus and Accela, Inc. for the purpose of software maintenance and support services utilized by the Department of Building and Zoning Services; which also supports daily operational functions that benefit various city departments and divisions such as, yet not limited to: the Department of Development, the Department of Public Utilities, and transportation divisions in the Public Service Department. These maintenance and support services include technical assistance, support, upgrades, and telephone support services for the Accela Automation (AA) System application, used to issue building permits, track code enforcement activities and monitor the performance of the One Stop Shop. Without the passage of this legislation, the Department of Technology will lose the ability to maintain the AA application, eliminating the ability to provide web access for building permits, data, and information utilized by citizens regarding issues such as building permits and inspections.

Finally, this ordinance requests approval to provide services by Accela in accordance with sole source procurement provisions of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Code as it has been determined Accela, Inc. is the sole distributor of the AA application, and does not utilize distributors or resellers to provide maintenance and support for its software products.

EMERGENCY: Emergency action is requested to expedite authorization of this contract in order to facilitate and maintain uninterrupted services from the supplier.

FISCAL IMPACT:

In 2016 (\$356,320.45) and 2017 (\$336,572.44) was legislated to be expended for additional licenses purchased in 2016 along with software maintenance and support services for the Accela, Inc. application. For year 2018, software maintenance and support services will cost \$356,197.62. Funds are budgeted and available within the Department of Technology, direct charge agencies, Information Services Operating Fund.

1. Introduction:

The Site is comprised of 55 +/- acres, bisected by and with frontage on both the east and the west sides of Ulry Road, located approximately 1500 feet south of the intersection of Central College and Ulry Roads and approximately 1100 feet north of the intersection of Warner and Ulry Roads.

For the Site area located on the west side of Ulry Road, the Site is surrounded by residential development developed in Blendon Township. The Site area located on the east side of Ulry Road, City of Columbus parkland is adjacent both south and east, and to the north of the Site is a condominium development commonly known as Asherton Grove sharing approximately 1200 feet of common property line with the Site, a single-family use sharing approximately 380 feet of common property line with the Site.

The property lies within the Northland Community Council planning area and is recommended for residential development up to a density of 3 units per acre. The proposed PUD-4 is consistent with the plan recommendation.

2. Permitted Uses: The development of a maximum of 163 single family dwelling units, along with open

space and parkland shall be the Permitted Uses.

3. Development Standards: The Site shall be developed with single family dwelling units developed under the R-2 development standards as amended herein, and open space and parkland as shown on the attached site plan titled "Development Plan Ulry Road," dated February 21, 2018.

A. Setbacks/Lot Dimensions/Lot Commitments

- 1. The minimum Side Yard permitted on one side of each lot may be a minimum zero (0) feet, provided that the sum of the widths of both side yards equal or exceeds twenty percent (20%) of the lot frontage, and that there is a minimum of ten feet (10') of separation between dwelling units, and that there be, provided by plat, suitable maintenance easements on adjoining property.
- 2. Rear Yard shall be no less than 20% of the total lot area.
- 3. In ground improvements such as pools or hot tubs may be built in side yards provided they are a minimum of five feet (5') away from adjacent dwelling unit.
- 4. Lots numbered 1-20, 38-51, 74-78, and 122-127 shall be a minimum of 130 feet deep and have a minimum rear yard set-back of 35 feet.
- 5. The intersection of the corner of the lot lines for numbered Lot 20 shall be no further south of the northern property line than 80 feet and no closer to the western property line than 52 feet as shown on the attached Detail Fence Exhibit dated March 25, 2018.

B. Access, Parking and/or Other Traffic Related Commitments.

- 1. Access will be in accordance with the review and approval of the City of Columbus Department of Public Service, Traffic Management Division.
- 2. The Developer will dedicate right-of-way to the City of Columbus per the City of Columbus Thoroughfare Plan, on both the east and west side of the Ulry Road frontage.
- 3. The Developer shall build a northbound left turn lane, 285 feet in length (includes a 50 foot diverging taper). The Developer shall install a southbound left turn lane, 285 feet (includes a 50 foot diverging taper). Access points to be as shown on the Development Plan.
- 4. The Developer shall install a leisure path along the east side of the Ulry Road frontage connecting to the existing 5 foot sidewalk to the north and matching the City parkland to the South.
- 5. The Developer shall dedicate a 10 foot wide easement to the City for a public pedestrian and bicycle connection between the Development's public street system and the future parkland dedicated by this rezoning (east side of Ulry Road). Final location of the easement to be determined at the time of final site compliance and based upon final site engineering.

C. Buffering, Landscape, Drainage, Open Space and/or Screening Commitments.

1. Developer shall install street trees along all internal public roads at 52 feet on center as shown on the PUD

plan.

- 2. Developer shall install street trees along Ulry Road at a rate of 4 per 100 linear feet which may be evenly spaced or grouped.
- 3. Black horse fence (detail as shown on the Development Plan) shall be installed on both sides of the Ulry Road frontage to match (as close as possible) the existing black horse fence on the adjoining property to the north on the eastside of Ulry Road.
- 4. A black horse fence (2 split rail) shall be installed along the rear of lots that are adjacent to the park land dedication area(s), on the west side of Ulry Road.
- 5. There shall be a no build tree conservation buffer area along a portion of the western property line, extending 52 feet from adjacent property (PID 110-003056 only) as shown on the Development Plan. There shall be no tree or brush removal with the exception of growth that is determined to be poisonous or a public health or safety concern by the City Health Department or City Recreation and Parks Department. At the request of the owner of PID 110-003056, the developer has agreed to retain the invasive honeysuckle within the no build zone unless it is replaced by new plantings that achieve the same opacity and screening **at the time of planting**. It is the intent of this provision to allow existing trees and brush within the buffer area to remain undisturbed to the greatest extent practicable in order to buffer new development from PID 110-003056
- 6. There shall be an approximate 5 acres of PUD open space, including detention pond, located in the southwest corner of the Site as depicted on the PUD Plan. In addition, there shall be approximately 5 acres, including detention pond, on the eastern portion of the site as depicted on the Development Plan, for a combined estimated total of 10 acres (approximately). The Developer shall dedicate and the City of Columbus Recreations and Parks Department agrees to accept a minimum of 2.5 acres, exclusive of any detention ponds, out of such 10 acres, in full satisfaction of the City's Parkland Dedication Ordinance. Location of dedicated parkland to be reviewed and approved by the Recreation and Parks Department and will be shown on final plat.
- 7. With the exception of requirements that may be imposed by the Department of Public Utilities with regard to location and specifications of sanitary sewer and water line installation, the developer shall use best construction practices, including construction fencing and signage as needed, so as to preserve the existing trees along the south property lines (east side of Ulry Road) during the course of construction activities on site.
- 8. Final parkland, open space, and or the preservation of trees may be modified based upon final engineering and/or utilities (storm water or sewer lines) as required by the Department of Public Utilities or other City Departments, as may apply.
- 9. The Developer shall plant 6-7 foot tall evergreen spruce trees, spaced at 9 foot on center, along the rear property lines in the rear yard of Lots numbered 1-20, 38-51, 74-78, and 122-127.
- 10. The Developer shall install a two rail black horse fence on the east side of 52' preservation area, along the entire length of the preservation area where parallel to PID 110-003056 (only) as shown on the attached Detail Fence Exhibit dated March 25, 2018.
- D. Building Design and/or Interior-Exterior Treatment Commitments.
- 1. The main exterior building materials will be wood, wood composition, brick, brick veneer, stone, stone veneer,

- 3. Dwelling units may be used as model homes for the purpose of marketing and sales. A paved parking lot shall be permitted on a lot or lots adjacent to model homes to provide off-street parking for model homes.

E. Graphics.

All signage and graphics for shall conform to the Columbus Graphics Code as it applies to R-2 zoning classification. Any variances needed from the applicable graphics requirements shall be submitted to the Columbus Graphics Commission.

This legislation will authorize the Director of Public Service to execute project agreements to accept funding

from the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) for the Resurfacing - Urban Paving - SR33 Dublin Rd/Spring Street (PID 86651) project, to accept and expend grant funds, and issue refunds if necessary after final accounting is performed.

Urban Paving projects are joint resurfacing projects between the local municipality and ODOT where ODOT will provide 80 percent of resurfacing funds while the municipality provides a 20 percent match. The funding for any required ADA curb ramps is 100% the responsibility of the municipality.

The Resurfacing - Urban Paving - SR33 Dublin Rd/Spring Street (PID 86651) project will resurface Dublin Road and Long Street from the Grandview Corporation limit to Marconi Boulevard and Spring Street from High Street to Cleveland Avenue. Street resurfacing is performed on roadways with problems on the surface course, but generally with a good base. This can consist of simple asphalt overlays up to mill and fill projects where the top inch or so are planed and new asphalt is placed, creating a new wearing surface and restoring the roadway to like new condition. Work to be performed also includes replacing pavement markings and loop detectors, and bringing sidewalks ramps into compliance with ADA standards.

No financial participation is required at this time. City funds will be approved in the form of design contracts, right of way acquisition, and/or construction contracts that will be submitted for Council's approval.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance funds a truancy program in partnership with the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) of Central Ohio, a non-profit organization located on West Long Street in Downtown Columbus. Since 2001, the YMCA, the Columbus Police Department, and Columbus City Schools have partnered to provide positive alternatives and safe environments to students who have been suspended or are

truant from schools. Police officers will transport youth that are truant from school during the day to the YMCA of Central Ohio, who will supervise them until their parent or guardian can pick them up. Staff members at the YMCA will work with the family when they arrive to help identify and resolve any issues that may be present and review the truancy law and its implications to both youth and parents.

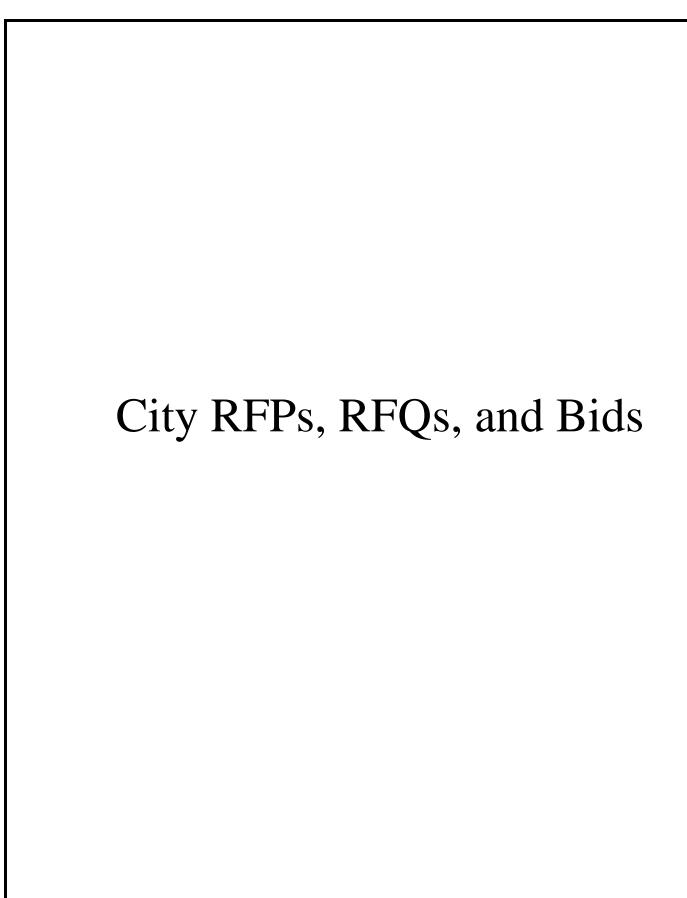
