Background: Ordinance 1699-2020, passed by Council on November 16, 2020 (the "Rezoning Ordinance), rezoned the property at or near the northwest corner of the intersection of West Broad Street and Doherty Road and generally located at 5960 West Broad Street (tax parcel ID 570-184818, the "Developer Property") now owned by Crown Pointe, LLC, an affiliate of Metro Development, LLC (collectively, the "Developer") and tax parcel ID 570-301099 (the "Adjacent Property"). The Developer purchased the 9.023 acres encompassing the Developer Property in order to privately invest approximately \$18 million to construct one-hundred ninety-two (192) multi-family units and private improvements pursuant to the Rezoning Ordinance. with the Big Darby Accord Watershed Master Plan and the Rezoning Ordinance, the Developer Property and Adjacent Property are subject to the requirements of the "Big Darby Revenue Program" pursuant to Resolution 0216X-2008 adopted by Columbus City Council on April 20, 2009. The Big Darby Revenue Program identified three revenue generation sources: tax increment financing (TIF), new community authority (NCA) charges, and per unit developer contributions (collectively the "Big Darby Revenue") for Big Darby Accord Purposes, i.e. Big Darby public improvements, and other regional public improvements. Pursuant to Ordinance 2535-2020 passed by Council on November 23, 2020, the Director of the Department of Development entered into an agreement (the "Big Darby Agreement") dated December 1, 2020 with the Developer to outline the plans and respective commitments of the City and Developer for the fulfillment of Big Darby Revenue Program requirements, including establishing a new NCA, in relation to the Developer Property and Adjacent Property. On April 7, 2021, a petition for the organization of the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA (the "Petition") was By this resolution, City Council, as the organizational board of filed with the Clerk of City Council. commissioners described and required by Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code ("R.C."), will determine the sufficiency of the Petition, authorize a public notice, and set a public hearing date on the Petition.

Emergency Justification: Emergency action is requested in order to facilitate the development of the Developer Property in a timely manner in accordance with the Big Darby Agreement and in order to provide notice in a newspaper for three weeks prior to a public hearing and set the public hearing date within 30-45 days of the date after the Petition was filed in accordance with R.C. Chapter 349.

Fiscal Impact: No funding is required for this legislation.

To determine that the petition to establish the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community Authority is sufficient and complies with the requirements of Chapter 349 of the Ohio Revised Code; to set the time and place for a public hearing on the petition; to authorize the notice of such public hearing by publication in a newspaper; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Crown Point LLC (the "Developer") plans to develop an approximately 9.023-acre site (the "Developer Property") located within the municipal corporate boundaries of the City of Columbus, Ohio (a municipal corporation, hereafter, the "City") as eight three-story multi-family residential buildings of approximately one hundred ninety-two (192) multi-family units with appropriate associated amenities, and surface and structured parking necessary to support those uses; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 1699-2020 rezoning the Developer Property and authorized by Ordinance

2535-2020, the Director of the Department of Development entered into an agreement (the "Big Darby Agreement") dated December 1, 2020 with an affiliate of the Developer to outline the plans and respective commitments of the City and the Developer for the fulfillment of the Big Darby Revenue Program requirements, including establishing a new community authority, in relation to the Developer Property; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2021 the Developer submitted to the Council of the City ("Council"), pursuant to Section 349.03 of the Ohio Revised Code ("R.C."), a Petition for Establishment of the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community Authority under R.C. Chapter 349 (the "Petition"); and

WHEREAS, the Big Darby West Broad Street New Community District, as described in the Petition, is located entirely within the municipal corporate boundaries of the City and this Council, as the legislative authority of the City, is therefore the organizational board of commissioners for purposes of this Petition in accordance with R.C. Chapter 349; and

WHEREAS, this Council has reviewed the Petition, and by this resolution desires to legislatively determine, pursuant to R.C. Section 349.03, that the Petition complies with the requirements of that section as to form and substance; pursuant to R.C. Chapter 349 all for the preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; NOW, THEREFORE,

This legislation authorizes the City of Columbus to accept and appropriate two federal Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) sub awards from the Franklin County Board of Commissioners Office of Justice Policy and Programs. Grant awards support prosecution and victim advocacy services provided by the Columbus City Attorney's Office. Award dollars fund 1) a portion of salary and fringe for two specially trained domestic violence prosecutors; 2) total compensation for one specially trained anti-stalking victim advocate; 3) and professional development for Domestic Violence & Stalking Unit staff.

The Domestic Violence & Stalking Unit provides best-practice prosecution services for victims of misdemeanor domestic violence and stalking crimes. The unit employs five highly-trained and experienced domestic violence prosecutors, fifteen victim advocates, one stalking investigator, one anti-stalking victim advocate and hosts professional liaisons from CHOICES domestic violence shelter and Franklin County Children Services. Services provided by the unit are modeled after the National District Attorneys Association's National Domestic Violence Prosecution Best Practice Guide and are designed to increase and improve victim involvement; decrease recantation; and increase community and law enforcement collaboration. This ordinance authorizes the appropriation of grant funds and the transfer and appropriation of the matching funds required by the grant award.

This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into multiple indefinite quantity contracts for the Project Dry Basement: Backwater Valve Installation and/or Sump Pump program, the work consists of installing backwater valves and sump pumps and other such work as may be necessary to complete the contract for the Division of Sewerage and Drainage. The goal of this program is designed to prevent sewer backups in single and two-family homes in Columbus due to surcharging in city sewers from heavy rain or sewer blockages by protecting the home up to the top of casting of the nearest upstream manhole with a Spears or pre-approved backwater valve, which allows use of plumbing fixtures above that elevation in the remainder of the home. Only homes deemed eligible by the City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage qualify for this program. Under this program an eligible home with an interior perimeter foundation drain connection to the lateral is also eligible, at the owner's option, for the installation of a sump pump that will redirect the foundation drainage away from the sanitary lateral to the sump pump and then discharge that drainage away from the house. This contract is estimated to last 3 years.

The Department of Public Utilities advertised for competitive bids (RFQ018044) for the subject project on the City's Vendor Services website and in the City Bulletin in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of City Code, relating to competitive sealed bids. The Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage intends to award multiple contracts to the lowest, responsive and best bidders, in the best interest of the City. The contracts will run concurrently and the Department of Public Utilities, Division of Sewerage and Drainage may utilize any contract at the discretion of the City of Columbus. The City of Columbus shall not be precluded from contracting for the same or similar work from other contractors, whether during the term of any contract awarded hereunder or otherwise.

The Department of Public Utilities received two (2) bids on March 31, 2021 and the Division of Sewerage and Drainage is recommending awards to the lowest, responsible and best bidders as follows:

Each vendor will be awarded all Items. Total Estimated Annual Expenditure for the combined contracts: \$1,900,000.00, Division of Sewerage and Drainage.

The term of these contracts shall be for a period of one year from the date of execution by the City of Columbus, with yearly renewal options for an additional two years (for a maximum contract length of three years), on a year by year basis, based on funding availability, mutual agreement between the City and each vendor, approval by ordinance of Columbus City Council, and appropriation and certification of funds by the City Auditor. BACKGROUND: The 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan combine into a single submission the planning and application aspects of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) programs. This plan represents a continuing commitment to provide decent housing, suitable living environments and expanded economic opportunities over the five-year period. Ord#2162-2019 adopted and authorized the submission of the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan. The City of Columbus, Grants Management Division is responsible for completing and submitting the Annual Action Plan to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Ord#2345-2020 was approved December 14, 2020 to adopt the proposed 2021 Annual Action Plan to allow the City to plan for and incur pre-award costs associated with the anticipated 2021 HUD award allocations. Ord#2469-2020 was approved to appropriate a portion of the CDBG award contingent upon the passage of Ord#2345-2020.

On March 9, 2021 the City of Columbus received the award letter detailing the 2021 HUD allocations for each grant program. HUD has directed the Grants Management Division to submit the 2021 Annual Action Plan once the actual award allocations have been determined. The purpose of this ordinance is to adopt the 2021 HUD Final Annual Action Plan; to authorize Grants Management to submit the 2021 Annual Action with the U.S. Department of HUD, and to appropriate \$72,500 from the unappropriated balance of 2021 CDBG grant funds.

FISCAL IMPACT: The City expects to receive about \$13 million in annual grant resources for the four programs listed above. The detailed award letter is attached to this ordinance. Ord#2469-2020 authorized the appropriation of \$3,783,500 in CDBG funds. This ordinance will appropriate another \$72,500 from the unappropriated balance. The Grants Management Division will submit future legislation to authorize appropriations or expenditures of the remaining unappropriated funds.

EMERGENCY LEGISLATION: This ordinance is submitted as an emergency to ensure the timely submission of the Annual Action Plan and allow the financial transaction to be posted in the City's accounting system as soon as possible to incur pre-award costs.

To adopt the 2021 HUD Final Action Plan which implements the second year of the five-year "Consolidated Plan" for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) programs; and to authorize the filing of the Annual Action Plan with the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; to authorize the appropriation of \$72,500.00 from the unappropriated balance of the CDBG fund, and to declare an emergency.

The OEM's policy puts us in the position of relying on our current vendor ConvergeOne. The attached project quote will allow for maintenance and support services for the City's existing IVR environments. The project quote includes the following: quote reflects a full five (5) year cost, but is broken down annually. BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the appropriation and expenditure of up to \$300,000.00 of the 2020 HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) entitlement grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and to enter into a commitment letter, loan agreement, promissory note, mortgage, and restrictive covenant with Bretton Woods Senior Housing Limited Partnership for the Bretton Woods project. National Church Residences will act as the developer, owner, management agent, and service provider of Bretton Woods.

Bretton Woods is a 75-unit, mixed-income senior housing community with wraparound supportive services. This project will provide a mix of one and two-bedroom units with a blend of income restricted Low-Income Housing Credit (LIHTC) units and unrestricted, market-rate units. National Church Residences will be seeking 9% LIHTCs from the Ohio Housing Finance Agency. There will be at least two HOME funding assisted units included in this project.

This senior housing community will offer a blend of affordable and market-rate units: 63 units will be affordable to households earning 60 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI), while 12 units will be unrestricted. By providing several unrestricted units, National Church Residences will better serve households marginally above the income-qualifying threshold for a Low-Income Housing Credit that would otherwise be turned away. Additionally, this strategy would provide opportunity for households with incomes that initially qualify, but increase above the LIHTC threshold over time and would therefore no longer meet program regulations to remain living in the community.

The proposed site for this senior housing community is 4836 Cleveland Avenue in Columbus, located at the intersection of Cleveland Avenue and Bretton Woods Drive. The site is located in close proximity to neighborhood services, shopping, public transportation, and healthcare services. A Central Ohio Transit Authority (COTA) stop is located at the intersection adjacent to the site, providing easy and affordable access for residents to travel on the #6 or CMAX with service to Downtown Columbus or north to Polaris. Additionally, residents are less than half a mile of the Gillie Senior Recreation Center located at 2100 Morse Road with free or discounted activities for those 50 years of age or older.

This project will boost the inventory of affordable senior housing in the Northland neighborhood, which the Ohio State University's Kirwan Institute identifies as a place of high senior density and vulnerability in a 2017 report. Despite this urgent need for affordable senior housing in the Northland community, the Bretton Woods project would be only the second senior, affordable housing development in Columbus' Northland community.

PSH is housing with linkages to services that help residents successfully maintain housing and rebuild their lives.

The following legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Public Service to execute those documents necessary for the City to grant the encroachment easements to legally allow these items to be placed within the public rights-of-way. Installation of these elements will enhance the area and fit into the architectural desire. A value of \$500.00 for the encroachment easements was established.

2. Fiscal Impact

There is no cost to the City to grant the easements. The City will receive a total of \$500.00, to be deposited in Fund 7748, Project 537650, for granting the requested encroachments.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to execute those documents necessary for the City to grant the encroachment easements to VS State Street, LLC along East State Street. (\$0.00)

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, Department of Public Service, received a request from the property owner, VS State Street, LLC, asking that the City allow 3 canopies to encroach into the public right-of-way. These encroachments will be within the public right-of-way located along the south side and in front of 21 East State Street; and

WHEREAS, this project is to enhance the entrance of the building and are designed to fit into the architectural desire as described below and shown on the attached exhibit; and

WHEREAS, a value of \$500.00 to be deposited in Fund 7748, Project P537650, for the encroachment easements was established; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service to authorize the Director to execute those documents necessary for the City to grant the encroachments to legally allow these items to be placed within the public rights-of-way; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Installation of these elements will enhance the area and fit into the architectural desire; to-wit:

3 Dimensional Encroachment Easement BETWEEN THE ELEVATIONS OF 789.90 feet AND 793.90 feet (NAVD88) (Geoid 12B)

Situated in the State of Ohio, Franklin County, City of Columbus, and being part of the right of way of State Street as dedicated in the Plat of the Original Town of Franklinton (Plat Book 3, Page 247) and being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the easterly line of High Street (100 feet wide) with the southerly line of State Street (82.5 feet wide), said point also being the northwesterly corner of Lot 1 in the Patterson, Minor and Adams Subdivision of Lots 334, 335 and 336 in the Original Town of Franklinton (Plat Book 15, Page 140);

Thence along the southerly line of State Street and the northerly line of said Patterson, Minor, and Adams Subdivision North 810 51' 35" East for a distance of 107.26 feet to the TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING:

Ft.), more or less, and being subject to all other legal easements, agreements, and rights-of-way of record.

The above described area shall encompass the canopy for the building located at the northwesterly corner of State Street and High Street. The vertical limits are specifically identified as being from elevation 789.90' to 793.90'. The existing sidewalk elevation below these items is 766.90'.

This description was prepared by Daniel L. Quick, Ohio Professional Surveyor Number 7803 from an actual field survey performed on March 17, 2020.

The horizontal bearings shown herein are based on the Ohio State Plane Coordinate System, South Zone, North American Datum of 1983 (NSRS 2007 adjustment) with the southerly line of State Street being N 81°51'35" E. The vertical elevations shown are based on NAVD88 (Geoid 12B).

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of Development to enter into grant agreements with recipients of the Department of Development, Division of Housing's Critical Home Repair Program and to make payments directly to the contractor who performed the work. The Department desires to encumber \$400,000.00 of bond funds for this program and will enter into multiple agreements under the authority of this ordinance.

The Critical Home Repair Program is open to households up to 80% AMI with the exception of participants in the Better Municipal Care for Veterans Program which may go up to 120% AMI. Households apply and if the application is approved, then City staff write the specifications for the project and publicly advertise through Bid Express. The homeowner makes a selection from the bids received that are within 15% of the estimate prepared by the City. The City then enters into a grant agreement with the homeowner, the homeowner signs the contract with the contractor, but the City pays the contractor directly.

Critical Home Repair projects include things like roofs, windows (as necessary for security purposes) and doors, and mechanical repairs for emergency situations (i.e. faulty/dangerous electric, no heat, clogged sewer mains). As the program has evolved, the department has learned that some critical home repair projects are more involved than originally expected, resulting in additional costs unanticipated by the homeowner, City, and the

contractor. As such, the Director is also seeking authority to modify Critical Home Repair contracts as issues are discovered, up to the amount of funds remaining on the ACPO. This will allow the department to immediately authorize the additional work needed without stopping work to seek Council approval for a contract modification.

Emergency action is requested to prevent disruption in the Critical Home Repair Program.

Fiscal Impact: \$400,000.00 is available in the 2020 Capital Improvement Budget, Housing Preservation bond fund. An amendment to the 2020 Capital Budget is required to establish sufficient budget authority for the project.

1. BACKGROUND: This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a professional engineering services agreement with GS-OH, Inc., for the Riverview Drive Area Water Line Improvements Project, in an amount up to \$274,671.87, for Division of Water Contract No. 2256.

The purpose of this project is to construct necessary improvements to the water distribution system in the Riverview Drive Area. The improvements identified in the scope of work will replace or rehabilitate water lines that have high break histories and require frequent maintenance. This project includes replacing or rehabilitating approximately 8,935 linear feet of 2-inch, 6-inch, and 8-inch water lines.

This project is located within the "38 - Olentangy West" community planning area and includes the following streets: Riverview Drive, Harley Drive, West Pacemont Road, Indianola Avenue, East Kenworth Road, Karl Road Cul-de-sac, Norwood Street, Huy Road, and Brentnell Boulevard.

- 2. ECONOMIC IMPACT/ADVANTAGES; COMMUNITY OUTREACH; PROJECT DEVELOPMENT; ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS/ADVANTAGES OF PROJECT: The goal of this project is to replace or rehabilitate the existing water lines that have a high break frequency. Replacement of these water lines will improve water service, decrease burden on water maintenance operations, and reduce water loss. The Neighborhood Liaison(s) will be contacted and informed of this project during the design phase. Further community outreach may result through the Neighborhood Liaison Program.
- **3. BID INFORMATION:** The selection of the firm providing the professional engineering services has been performed in accordance with the procedures set forth in Columbus City Code, Section 329, "Awarding professional service contracts through requests for proposals." The evaluation criteria for this contract included: 1. understanding of project, 2. past performance, 3. environmentally preferable consultants, 4. local workforce, and 5. anticipated project team.
- Six (6) Requests for Proposal (RFP) was received on February 5, 2021 from: ms consultants, GS-OH, HDR Engineering, PRIME AE Group, Ribway Engineering, and AECOM.

An evaluation committee reviewed the proposal and recommends that the Riverview Drive Area Water Line Improvements Project be awarded to GS-OH, Inc.

The Contract Compliance Number for GS-OH, Inc. is 62-1736493 (expires 2/4/22, MAJ) and their DAX Vendor Number is 9789. Additional information regarding all bidders, description of work, contract time frame, and detailed amount can be found on the attached Information form.

Searches in the Excluded Party List System (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against GS-OH, Inc.

BACKGROUND: The City's Department of Public Service ("DPS") is performing the Urban Infrastructure Recovery Fund ("UIRF") - Far South Project (Project No. 440005-100075) ("Public Project"). The City must acquire certain fee simple title and lesser real estate located in various areas on the far south side of Columbus (collectively, "Real Estate") in order for DPS to timely complete the Public Project. The City passed Ordinance Number 0226-2020 authorizing the City Attorney to acquire the Real Estate. Furthermore, the City also adopted Resolution 0154X-2020 establishing the City's intent to appropriate the Real Estate. The City's acquisition of the Real Estate will help make, improve, or repair certain portions of the public right-of-way of the far south side of Columbus which will be open to the public without charge.

The City Attorney, pursuant to Columbus City Code, Section 909.03, served notice to all of the owners of the Real Estate of the (i) Public Project's public purpose and necessity, and (ii) adoption of Resolution 0154X-2020. However, the City Attorney was unable to either locate some of the Real Estate's owner(s) or agree with some of the Real Estate's owner(s) in good faith regarding the amount of just compensation.

This legislation authorizes the Director of the Department of Technology, on behalf of the Columbus Public Health Department, to enter into a contract with Accela Inc. for annual software license maintenance and support services for the Envision Connect system utilized by the Environmental Health unit. The original contract (EL000490) was established by the Columbus Health Department in 2000 with Decade Software Company. Decade Software Company was acquired by Accela in November 2014. The Envision Connect agreement was most recently renewed by authority of ordinance 1366-2020, passed July 2, 2020, through purchase order PO204353. This renewal will provide service from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 at a cost of \$131,684.64.

The Envision Connect system provides the Columbus Public Health Department the ability to operate the Environmental Health unit by providing an extensive array of services such as tracking and maintaining information associated with inspections, historical data of restaurants and other businesses, tracking sanitation standards data, vector control for mosquitoes, environmental reviews, accounts receivable/payable and billings as well as statistics and analysis regarding the Environmental Health unit. Services provided by Accela under

this contract renewal include telephone support services, software maintenance, update training, upgrades and enhancements, and application hosting services. Without this service, the Columbus Public Health Department would lose the ability to operate the Environmental Health unit, which could result in the failure to meet requirements mandated by the State of Ohio.

Accela Inc. is the sole provider of maintenance and support for Envision Connect software. As such, this ordinance is being established in accordance with the sole source provisions of the Columbus City Code, Section 329.

Fiscal Impact

In 2019 and 2020, funds totaling \$113,382.71 and \$125,413.94, respectively, were legislated for software license, hosting and support services for the Envision Connect system. The cost for 2021 software license, hosting and support services for Envision Connect is \$131,684.64. Funds were budgeted and available within the Columbus Public Health Department's direct charge allocation of the Department of Technology, Information Services Operating Fund.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Safety to enter into a contract with Idemia Identity & Security USA, LLC, formally Morpho Trak, Inc., to continue payments for the upgrade and technical support of the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) for the Division of Police.

The City of Columbus entered into an agreement with Morpho Trak, Inc. in 2015 to upgrade the City's 15 year old AFIS which was at approximately 90 percent capacity on fingerprint inventory. The agreement required the city to make lease payments to the vender over an eleven year period to cover the cost of the upgrade as well as to provide maintenance and technical support of the new system for the duration of the agreement. The new upgraded system, completed in 2016, provides technology that increases the Division's latent fingerprint accuracy, meaning it provides the Division tools to help identify suspects quickly and more accurately. The Division of Police anticipates a significant increase in unsolved latent fingerprint hits just by using newer technology. The Division will be able to query searches to multiple agencies and databases which includes wanted person, persons of special interest, sexual offenders, and terrorist watch list.

Bid Information: The initial contract was awarded pursuant to the sole source provisions of Chapter 329 of Columbus City Code due to the proprietary nature of AFIS technology, and the prohibitive cost of conversion to a different system.

This company is not debarred according to the Federal excluded parties listing or prohibited from being awarded a contract according to the Auditor of State unresolved findings for recovery certified search.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes an expenditure of \$944,027.00 to continue payments for the upgraded Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). CUL will manage a program to provide rental and utility assistance to residents in the local area who qualify for the assistance as provided in the laws regulations and other current guidance provided by the U. S. Department of Treasury. BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of Development to enter into grant agreements with recipients of the Department of Development, Division of Housing's Homeownership Development Program for purpose of providing development and affordability assistance to non-profit organizations constructing or rehabilitating affordable housing. The Department desires to encumber \$770,000.00 of bond funds for this program and will enter into multiple agreements under the authority of this ordinance.

As such, the Director is also seeking authority to modify HDP contracts as issues are discovered, up to the amount of funds remaining on the ACPO. This will allow the department to immediately authorize the additional work needed without stopping work to seek Council approval for a contract modification.

Carahsoft Technology Corporation for software licensing, maintenance, and support with Accela, Inc., for the period May 1, 2021 to April 30, 2022, in the amount of \$469,100.66.. This is being done on behalf of the Departments of Building and Zoning Services, Development, Public Utilities, and Public Service.

The original contract for this software (CT17745) was awarded to Open Data Systems as a solution for tracking building permit activity. The annual contract was then transferred to Accela, Inc. in 2001 when Open Data Systems was acquired under ordinance 1754-01, which passed October 22, 2001. The most recent contract for Accela licensing, maintenance and support was authorized by ordinance 2557-2020, (passed November 23, 2020), which authorized a three month contract, ending on April 30, 2021. This ordinance authorizes a new contract, beginning on May 1st, 2021 and ending on April 30, 2022.

Passage of this ordinance will ensure continuation of software maintenance and support services for Accela systems, used by the Departments of Building and Zoning Services, Development, Public Utilities, and Public Service. Services provided through this contract include technical assistance, support, upgrades and telephone support services for the Accela Automation System application, used to issue building permits, track code enforcement activities and monitor the performance of the One Stop Shop. Without the passage of this legislation, the Department of Technology will lose the ability to maintain the city's permitting system, removing the ability to provide web access for building permits, data and information utilized by citizens regarding issues such as building permits and inspections

This ordinance also waives the competitive bidding provisions of Columbus City Codes. DoT is unable to use the STS due to change/new SKUs to a GSA-derived ST. A vendor files their new GSA SKUs and price with the state, and the state reviews, approves and amends the STS. Without the GSA SKUs, the state lacks authority under its waiver of competitive selection to amend its STS. The new SKUs we need under Accela has not yet been established under GSA

Finally, this ordinance authorizes the expenditure of \$469,100.66 for the above-described purpose.

FISCAL IMPACT

In 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 the department legislated \$336,572.44, \$356,197.62, \$415,106.86, and \$115,587.04 respectively for Accela software licensing, maintenance, and support. The current contract, which expires on April 30th, 2021, was legislated for a three (3) month term, which began on January 31, 2021, at a cost of \$115,587. This ordinance authorizes the expenditure of \$469,100.66 to ensure continuation of Accela services. 

TREASURY INVESTMENT BOARD COLUMBUS, OHIO INVESTMENT GUIDELINES

This document, in conjunction with the Columbus City Charter and Columbus City Code, as amended, and the ordinances adopted by the City Council, as amended, will govern the investments and the investment activities including the administration and execution of all investment transactions for the City of Columbus. These guidelines will be reviewed annually for compliance to all applicable statues, and to assure the flexibility necessary to effectively manage the portfolio. Chapter 325 of the Columbus City Code is therefore and hereby made a part of these guidelines.

- 1. The primary objective is to protect the safety of the City's investments. The secondary objectives are maintaining liquidity and maximizing yield.
- All investment activities will be undertaken by the City Treasurer, the City's investment advisor, or those other
 persons assigned thereby to engage in investment activities. A current list of individuals authorized to transact
 securities trades or initiate wire transfers and/or confirmations for the City will be maintained with these guidelines.
- 3. All qualified financial institutions executing trades directly with the City of Columbus must complete and submit a Broker/Dealer Questionnaire, which shall be maintained and updated on an annual basis. All such institutions must be registered with the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA), the State of Ohio, Commerce Department, Securities Division and are subject to approval by the Treasury Investment Board. When trades are executed by the City's investment advisor, the investment advisor will perform the due diligence on the broker/dealers selected for trades on behalf of the City. The investment advisor's due diligence shall include an annual review of the broker/dealer's trade execution, registration with proper regulatory authorities and review of any disciplinary or legal actions against the firm's investment representatives as reported by FINRA. The City reserves the right to request additional information on a case-by-case basis.
- 4. A copy of the City Code indicating permissible investments will be kept with these guidelines.
- 5. No security will be purchased that has a remaining term to final maturity of more than five years unless the security meets the following criteria:
 - a. The security is an assessment bond or note issued by the City of Columbus, Ohio; and
 - b. The purchase is approved by the Treasury Investment Board
- 6. All investments transactions shall be executed on the basis of delivery versus payment and shall be held in third-party safekeeping by an institution designated by the Treasury Investment Board as custodian or primary agent. The custodian shall issue a receipt listing the specific investment, rate, maturity, and any other pertinent information.
 - Delivery versus payment shall mean the broker-dealer will not be paid until the securities purchased are delivered to the City or the City's custodian.
- 7. Gains on portfolio securities may be taken at the direction of the majority of the Treasury Investment Board members, consistent with the current market outlook. Investments may be redeemed or sold prior to maturity to meet additional liquidity requirements, to restructure the investment portfolio or to enhance the yield of the overall investment portfolio. Such changes may be made on a case by case basis and shall be subject to the approval of the City Treasurer or Deputy Treasurer.
- 8. All portfolio transactions will be performed on a competitive basis. It is understood that such competitiveness shall

be sought through electronic or telephonic quotes due to the nature of the business and the need for timely decision making.

- Officers and employees involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could
 conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial
 investment decisions.
- 10. A file will be maintained with these investment guidelines of all approved securities dealers and banks that the City will transact investment activities with, and include the appropriate financial reports and names of those individuals responsible for the City's account. The investment advisor will provide the City Treasurer with an annual report showing trades completed by broker/dealer as well as confirmation that all broker/dealers are properly registered with FINRA and the State of Ohio, Commerce Department, Securities Division. The Treasury Investment Board reserves the right to remove or add any broker/dealers to those used by the City's investment advisor.
- 11. All of the above requirements are to be maintained in compliance with the Columbus City Charter and the Columbus City Code.
- 12. Investment advisors, bankers and broker-dealers doing business directly with the City of Columbus and the City's investment advisor must acknowledge receipt of the City's Code Chapter 325 and Investment Guidelines and indicate their agreement to comply with such Code and Guidelines. Acknowledgement by the City's investment advisor will extend to include the broker/dealers used by the investment advisor in executing trades on behalf of the City.
- 13. The City Code prohibits investment in any form of derivatives, except for Star Ohio, and/or the use of reverse repurchase agreements.
- 14. The investment portfolio of the City must at all times provide ample liquidity and maturity date scheduling to allow the City to pay all of its cash demands in a timely manner.



REVISED BYLAWS

of

THE NORTH LINDEN AREAS COMMISSION

Amended July 16, 2020

ARTICLE I. NAME & BOUNDARIES

All members shall be appointed by the Mayor with the concurrence of City Council.

Section 1. There is hereby created in the city of Columbus a Commission area to be known as the North Linden Area Commission, hereafter in this document referred to as the Commission.

Section 2. This area shall be bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of the railroad right-of-way west of Joyce Ave. and Hudson St. and proceeding in a westerly direction along the center line of Hudson St. to the first north-south railroad right-of-way immediately east of Indianola Ave.; thence proceeding in a northerly direction along the centerline of the railroad right-of-way to Cooke Rd.; thence proceeding in an easterly direction along the centerline of Cooke Rd. to Karl Rd.; thence proceeding in a northerly direction along the centerline of Karl Rd. to Ferris Rd.; thence proceeding in an easterly direction along the centerline of Ferris Rd. to the north-south railroad right-of-way west of Joyce Ave.; thence proceeding in a southerly direction along the centerline of the railroad right-of-way to the point of beginning.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

Section 1. These Bylaws shall establish the proceedings by which the North Linden Area Commission shall execute its duties and functions under the grant of authority set forth in Chapter 3109 of the Columbus City Code.

Section 2. This Commission is established to afford citizen participation in the decision-making process functioning in an advisory capacity and to facilitate communication, understanding and cooperation between neighborhood groups, city officials and developers.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. There shall be maximum of 9 members of the Commission. All members shall be appointed by the mayor with concurrence of City Council.

- a) Seven (7) persons living in the Commission area shall be selected as resident members by the selection procedure outlined in Art. III, Sect. d.
- b) Two (2) members, who need not be area residents but who have shown a demonstrated interest in the area, shall be nominated by the selected members of the Commission.

- c) For selected members running for consecutive selected terms, the signatures of 25 residents within the area are not required.
- d) Except as otherwise specified, all members have equal rights.
- e) All members shall serve without compensation

Section 2. Selection, Terms, Vacancies

- a) Initially, terms shall be determined by lot with five (5) selected, two (2) nominated members and the Mayor's appointee serving for a term of three (3) years, four (4) selected and three (3) nominated serving for a term of two (2) years.
- b) Thereafter, all terms shall be for a period of three (3) years, staggered with four (4) of the commissioners' terms expiring on a given year and three (3) commissioners' terms expiring on a different year.
- c) Each term shall end on December 31 of the year the term expires.
- d) After the selection of initial Commissioners, selection of subsequent commission members shall be by residents of North Linden by petition and election.
 - i. Candidates must submit a resume, short biography, essay, and petition with signatures of at least 25 North Linden residents.
 - ii. Availability of petitions will be announced at the regular June and July meetings and published in available media.
 - iii. Petitions are due by the second Thursday in August.
 - iv. Candidates must be 18 years of age or older and be a North Linden Resident
 - v. Signers of petitions must be 18 years of age or older and be residents of North Linden.
 - vi. Petitions must contain 25 or more valid signatures for a candidate to be considered for selection.
 - vii. An election shall take place annually in the month of September.
 - a. All valid candidates, (Article III, Sect. 2d, i-vi), shall be placed on the ballot.
 - Election shall be by secret ballot. All North Linden residents and Commissioners attending the September meeting may cast a ballot.
 - viii. No election shall be scheduled if the number of candidates is less than or equal to the number of selected Commissioners with expiring terms.

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- e) Any vacancies caused by death, resignation, disqualification, or by other means shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the Mayor with the concurrence of Council. The area commission may recommend appointees to the Mayor to fill vacancies. Candidates for appointment must submit a resume, cover letter, essay and qualifying petition (ARTICLE III, Sect. 2d, i, iv-vi)
- f) Λ commissioner who is elected or appointed to a seat may not be elected or appointed to a different seat until the term of the seat held by the commissioner has expired.

Section 3. Expectations and Responsibilities of Commissioners

- a) No member shall represent the Commission in its official actions except as specifically authorized by a majority vote at a regular or special meeting. This shall not be construed as a restriction upon the rights of individual members to represent their own views before public or private bodies, whether in agreement or disagreement with the official actions of the Commission.
- b) Statements made by Commissioners outside of official meetings, including on social media, do not represent the Commission unless the Commissioner has been directly authorized by position or vote to represent and speak on behalf of the Commission.
- c) When presenting personal views before public or private bodies or on social media, Commissioners should clarify that they are not representing or speaking on behalf of the Commission.
- **Section 4.** If a member of the Commission selected by the selection procedures moves out of the described Commission area, such member must relinquish his or her resident status *in writing* and be replaced per Section 2e. Resignation will be officially announced at the next public meeting.

Section 5. Attendance

- a) Commissioners are required to attend all meetings of the Commission
- b) Commissioners who communicate an absence to the Chair prior to a public meeting will be deemed excused. Except for emergency, Commissioners are not permitted to have more than three (3) consecutive excused absences.
- c) Commissioners who fail to communicate absence to the Chair prior to a public meeting will be deemed un-excused. Two (2) consecutive unexcused absences from regular monthly meetings (Art. V, Sect.1) or from four (4) regular monthly meetings in a 12 month period are in violation of Sect. 5a.
- d) A Commissioner in violation of part (b) or (c) of this section will be officially removed by the Commission at the next regular meeting.

ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of the Commission shall be Chair, Vice-chair, Zoning Chair, and Treasurer.

Section 2. Officers shall be elected by a majority of the Commission members present at the October monthly meeting.

Section 3. Each Officer shall be elected for a term of one (1) year, beginning January 1.

Section 4. The duties of the officers shall be:

- a) The Chair shall preside at meetings of the Commission and prepare the agenda for Commission meetings, in consultation with the other Commission members.
- b) The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in the Chair's absence and shall perform such special duties that may arise from time to time at the request of the Chair.
- c) The Treasurer shall receive and submit all Commissioners' requests with receipts for reimbursement; and shall receive and disburse all funds of the Commission.

Section 5. The Vice-Chair shall fill a vacancy in the Chair position. A vacancy in every other position shall be filled by election by a majority of the Commission members present at the subsequent monthly meeting. A vacancy filled for six (6) months or more shall be considered full term.

Section 6. Election of officers shall be by roll call.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

- a) Regular meetings shall be on the third Thursday of each month at a stated time to be determined by two-thirds vote of the Commission and shall be open to the public. Regular meetings shall commence no later than 15 minutes after the stated time.
- b) The first regular meeting in January shall be the Annual Meeting at which time the new Commissioners shall take office, officers shall be elected by roll call (Article IV, Section 6) and annual reports from committees will be received.
- c) A regular meeting may be cancelled, or the meeting date changed, by a two-thirds vote of the Commission.

Section 2. Special Meetings

- a) Special meetings may be called by the Chair or by a majority of members present in a regular or special meeting or by the Chair at the written request of at least five (5) members.
- b) Written notice of any special meeting shall be given to each Commission member and the public at least seven (7) days in advance, except in an emergency. This written notice shall specify the date, time, and place of the meeting and describe all business to be conducted at the meeting.

- c) No business shall be conducted at a special meeting unless it was included in the notice of the special meeting.
- d) Special meetings shall be open to the public.

Section 3. Quorums

 Λ quorum shall be defined as greater than 50% of the Commission members. A majority of the Commission members present and voting shall be required to approve a motion, except as otherwise provided.

Section 4. The business of the Commission shall contain the following unless otherwise directed by a majority of members present:

Section 5. The Chair may recognize members of the public who wish to address the Commission and have turned in speaker slips concerning issues under discussion and on the agenda a) If a member of the public wishes to be included on the Agenda, the person must contact the

Chair. In turn, the Chair will inform the Commission.

b) The member of the public must state their name and the issue to be presented.

c) A uniform time limit for such presentations may be set by the Chair.

Section 6. Issues brought before the Commission that are not under discussion, nor on the Agenda may be discussed or tabled by a vote of a show of hands so that proper authorities can be consulted.

Section 7. When guests are invited to speak to the Commission the time will generally be limited to fifteen (15) minutes or at the discretion of the Chair.

Section 8. Dissenting or non-concurring Committee member's reports may be filed by Commission or committee members and shall be attached to the Standing and Special Committees' reports.

Section 9. Commission meetings shall be limited to not more than three (3) hours unless deemed appropriate and approved by a majority of the Commission members present.

Section 10. Except as otherwise specified, meetings of the Commission shall be conducted in an orderly and reasonable manner using the latest current revision of Robert's Rules of Order as a guide.

b) At the request of any Commissioner, a roll call vote may be granted.

ARTICLE VI. COMMITTEES

Section 1. Appointment of Commission members to both standing and special committees shall be made by the Chair in consultation with Commission members and shall be subject to the approval of a majority of the Commission members.

Section 2. Each standing committee may appoint persons who are not Commissioners as committee members, subject to the approval by the Commission. All committee members have voting privileges within that committee. Non-commissioners may or may not outnumber Commissioners on any standing committee.

Section 3. Each committee shall select a member to Chair the committee, and may select other Officers and adopt internal rules necessary to carry out their assigned task. The selected Chair of any committee shall be a Commissioner.

- a) The selected Chair of any committee may be requested to step down as the Chair of that committee by the Commission Chair. The selected Chair of any committee may be voted out as the Chair of that committee by a two-thirds majority vote of the Commission.
- b) Voting by the entire Commission, for the purpose of removing a selected Chair of a committee shall be conducted at a Special Meeting of the Commission.
- c) At any time before voting by the entire Commission, for the purpose of removing a selected Chair, the selected chair may resign the chair.
- d) Leaving the committee is the decision of the individual. If the individual remains on the committee, the individual shall not publicly represent the committee or the Commission in a position of authority with regard to that committee or any of that committee's functions. The individual is an internal member only on that committee.
- **Section 4.** A special committee may be established or dissolved by a majority vote of the Commission. Its size, powers and duties shall be specified by the creating resolution.

Section 5. All committee meetings must be publicized by sending the date, location, time and agenda to the Department of Neighborhoods at least 7 days in advance for submission to the city bulletin.

Section 6. The Chair of the Commission shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.

Section 7. The standing committees and their responsibilities are:

a) Executive Committee

1. Consists of Chair, Vice-Chair, Zoning Chair, and Treasurer;

2. Prepare the agenda of regular meetings; plan the direction and scope of Commission activities;

3. Review finances and policies.

b) Planning & Development Committee

1. Review & recommend long-range plans for the North Linden Area;

2. Investigate funding for implementation of such plans;

3. Develop methods for involving the citizens in such planning;

4. Maintain planning files.

c) Zoning Committee

Receive, review and make recommendations concerning applications for rezoning, zoning variances, demolitions and special permits for property located in the area.

d) Community Engagement Committee

- 1. Review social and recreation services in the area and take appropriate action to improve or maintain them;
- 2. Monitor consumer business relations in the area;
- 3. Initiate, coordinate or assist at community-wide events;

4. Work to develop a community identity;

- 5. Work to improve the quality of life for all our residents;
- 6. Publicize the North Linden Area Commission as a community resource.

e) Health & Safety Committee

- 1. Coordinate and/or initiate efforts to reduce crime in the community. Work with other groups as desired;
- 2. Initiate and/or help with efforts to maintain a clean community;
- 3. Initiate and/or assist with efforts to control conditions which interfere with the health of residents.

4. Sub-committee - Code Enforcement

- Report known code violations in the North Linden Area Commission area to the appropriate Code Enforcement officer of the City of Columbus;
- b. Become knowledgeable about code enforcement problems in the community and make constructive suggestions about remedying them; and
- c. The Committee may undertake programs to educate the community about code enforcement issues.

f) Job Creation and Workforce Development

1. Providing opportunities for entrepreneurship;

2. Partnering with businesses to offer employment.

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- 3. Sub-Committee Education
 - a. Linking business owners and educators;
 - b. Promoting training for employees.

g) Transportation Committee

Initiate and/or assist with efforts to alleviate vehicular traffic problems in the community

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ARTICLE VII. CODE OF CONDUCT

Commissioners have an obligation to limit comments from litigious content that jeopardizes the NLAC. If comments are deemed harmful, by the NLAC, to any member of the Public and/or the NLAC, then the offending Commissioner must issue a public statement for the record at the subsequent NLAC meeting. This statement must include reference to the offense and indicate that her/his opinions and comments were personal and had no bearing on the NLAC.

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

Section 1. A proposed amendment to these Bylaws shall be submitted in writing by any Commission member at any regular meeting.

- a) The proposed amendment shall first be read at the regular meeting when submitted and again at the next two (2) regular meetings following. The proposed amendment shall be voted on after the reading at the third regular meeting.
- b) With a unanimous vote of the Commission members present at the first reading, the proposed amendment may be voted on at the next regular meeting.
- c) Adoption of the proposed amendment shall be by a two-thirds majority vote of the entire Commission.

Section 2. In accordance with Chapter 3109 of the Columbus City Code, the approved amendment shall be filed immediately with the Department of Neighborhoods after its adoption. Such amendment shall take effect thirty (30) days after publication in the City Bulletin.



RENEWAL OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY DECLARATION

In response to the developing community health crisis surrounding COVID-19/Coronavirus and pursuant to Chapter 775 of the Columbus City Health Code, Chapter 3709 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the contract between Columbus Public Health and the City of Worthington, Resolution No. 20-08, a declaration of Public Health Emergency (PHE), to include the cities of Columbus and Worthington, was passed and issued by the Columbus Board of Health on March 13, 2020.

That declaration automatically terminated on April 12, 2020.

On March 17, 2020, pursuant to Chapter 775 of the Columbus City Health Code and Chapter 3709 of the Ohio Revised Code, Resolution No. 20-09, authorizing the Health Commissioner to declare a public health emergency without convening the Board of Health, was passed by the Columbus Board of Health.

Previous renewals of the original Board of Health PHE declaration issued on March 13, 2020 have expired.

The most recent renewal issued Thursday 3/25/21 will expire at 11:59pm on Friday 4/23/21.


Due to the ongoing community health emergency related to COVID-19/Coronavirus in the cities of Columbus and Worthington and consistent with the States of Emergency declared by the Governor of Ohio and the Mayor of Columbus and Orders issued by the Ohio Department of Health, and pursuant to the authority granted in Columbus Board of Health Resolution No. 20-09, Chapter 775 of the Columbus Health Code Chapter, and Chapter 3709 of the Ohio Revised Code, I hereby order:

Renewal of the Public Health Emergency declaration for the cities of Columbus and Worthington initially issued by the Columbus Board of Health on March 13, 2020. Unless amended or rescinded, this renewal shall be in effect from 12:00am on Saturday April 24, 2021 until 11:59pm on Sunday May 23, 2021.

This renewal of the PHE declaration shall supersede and take precedence over any prior renewal.

Southwest Area Commission Bylaws Revised

These Bylaws establish the procedure under which the Southwest Area Commission shall execute those duties and functions set forth in and with authority granted under Chapters 3109 and 3111 of the Columbus City Codes (herein abbreviated as C.C.).

Article I. Name

The name of this organization shall be the Southwest Area Commission, herein referred to as the "Commission".

Article II. Area

The boundaries of the Commission are to the north, Mound Street, Mt. Calvary and Greenlawn Avenues, to the east by the Scioto River, to the south by Interstate 270 and to the west by CSX Railroad tracks, or as detailed in C.C. 3111. The boundaries include the East side of Harmon Avenue from Greenlawn to Mound Street as well as the north side of Greenlawn Avenue to the Scioto River. The Commission serves the incorporated areas of the City of Columbus and strives to maintain an effective working relationship with the jurisdictions that fall within the Commission's boundaries which include: Franklin County, Franklin Township, Urbancrest and Jackson Township.

Article III. Purpose

- 1. The purpose of this Commission shall be to afford additional voluntary citizen participation in decision making in an advisory capacity to the City Administration and City Council and to facilitate communication, understanding, and cooperation between neighborhood groups, city officials, and developers. The Commission shall:
- A. In the interests of local planning for local needs, identify and study problems and requirements of the Commission Area in order to:
 - 1. Create plans and policies, which will serve as guidelines for future development of the Area:
- 2. Bring the problems and needs of the Area to the attention of appropriate government agencies or residents; and
 - 3. Recommend solutions or legislation.
- B. Air and promote communication within the Commission Area and between it and the rest of the City by means of:
 - 1. Regular and special meetings of the Commission which are open to the public.
 - 2. Public hearings on problems, issues or proposals affecting the area.
 - 3. Public forums and surveys to provide an opportunity for Area residents, businesses and organizations to state their problems and concerns.
 - 4. Soliciting active cooperation of all segments of the Area and City, including organizations, institutions, and government.
 - 5. Initiating proposals and supporting those introduced by individual citizens or area organizations, which will enhance the quality of life enjoyed by area residents and preserve the unique residential and commercial mix of the Area; and
 - 6. Promoting and encouraging businesses whose functions, methods of operation, architectural appearance, and locations are consistent with the character and requirement of the Area.

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- C. Initiate, review, and recommend criteria and programs for the preservation, development and enhancement of the Commission Area, including, but not limited to, parks, recreation areas, sidewalks, street, and traffic, by means of:
- 1. Reviewing the proposed Capital Improvements Budget and proposing new items and changes relating to the Area.
 - 2. Making recommendations for restoration and preservation of the historical elements within the Area; and
- 3. Receiving and reviewing for recommendation, prior to the adoption by governmental bodies, any new or revised comprehensive plan affecting the Area.
- D. Recommend priorities for and review government services and operation of the various government departments in the Commission Area by means of:
- 1. Requesting and receiving from departments or agencies periodic reports concerning governmental services or practices in the Area.
- 2. Meeting with administrative heads of any department or agency, or any of their subordinates, to obtain additional information deemed necessary for the Commission to fulfill its functions.
- 3. Requesting and receiving from departments or agencies, prior to implementation, full reports on any proposed changes in service or practice in the Area and recommending approval or disapproval of the proposed changes.
- 4. Reviewing and evaluating pending legislation substantially affecting the Area prior to its consideration by Council; and
 - 5. Review and comment on zoning issues and demolitions presented to the Commission.
- E. Recommend persons from the Commission Area for nomination to membership on City boards and commissions, which make decisions or recommendations affecting the Commission Area.
- 2. The Commission shall not endorse any candidate for public office.

Article IV. Membership

- 1. Appointment. All Commissioners shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City of Columbus in accordance with C.C. 3109. The Secretary shall notify the Department of Neighborhood Services of all nominations, elections, and vacancies within ten days of such action. The Department of Neighborhood Services will notify the Mayor's office and complete any publication requirements.
- A. Should the Mayor neither approve nor disapprove the action within thirty (30) days of notifications, the action shall be deemed approval until notice from the Mayor as specified in C.C.3109.
 - B. A copy of each notice shall be sent to the City Council in care of the City Clerk.
- 2. Members. The Commission shall consist of up to thirteen (13) members. Each member shall either reside, work or own property in the Commission Area and serve without compensation.
- A. Nine (9) Elected Commissioners shall be selected from the Southwest Area. The nine (9) Commissioners shall be selected in accordance with the selection rules adopted by the Southwest Area Commission. Each elected Commissioner must be a resident in the City of Columbus.
- B. Four (4) At-Large Commissioners, should either be employed, own real property or operate a business within the Area, shall be nominated by the Commission. The four (4) individuals nominated by the Commission may be from, but not limited to, the following: one (1) official from South-Western City Schools; one (1) from the fields of human services; one (1) representative of the Southwest Area clergy; and one (1) from the Southwest Area Business Association.
 - C. The Commission must maintain a majority of the members to be residents of the Southwest Area boundaries.
- 3. Terms. The term of membership of elected officials shall be three (3) years. All terms shall expire during the annual meeting in the year that the term expires; however, a member may continue to serve beyond term expiration until a successor is appointed. Terms shall be staggered so as to maintain continuity of experienced representation. As determined by lot, one-third of the initial membership shall serve for one (1) year; one third, for two (2) years; and the remaining one-third, for three (3) years or until their successors are appointed. Term of at-large commissioners shall be for three (3) years.

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- 4. No Commission member shall represent the Commission in its official actions before any other public body or official, except as specifically authorized in writing by the Commission. This shall not be construed as a restriction upon the right of the individual members to represent their own views before public or private bodies, whether in agreement or disagreement with the official action of the Commission.
- 5. Disqualification. Members shall maintain their residence, property or business in the Commission Area from which they were elected or appointed. Failure of a member to maintain his or her residence, property, or business in the Southwest Commission Area, shall be deemed a resignation and the Secretary shall notify the Mayor, City Clerk, and the Department of Neighborhoods.
- 6. Attendance. The year starts with the annual meeting. Members shall, so far as possible, be regular in attendance. A member's absence from four (4) regular meetings in any one (1) year, shall be deemed a resignation from the Commission, unless a petition has been received by the Chairperson of the Commission. The Commission must act upon the petition after it is received at either the next regularly scheduled meeting or the following regularly scheduled meeting. The petition must be made in writing and received by the Chairperson at least eight (8) days prior to the next regular meeting following the fourth absence. The petition is to request that some or all of the absences be excused due to extenuating circumstances. The nature of the extenuating circumstances shall be explained. If the Commission accepts, by majority vote, all or portion of the absences may be excused. If a petition is not received, it shall be deemed a resignation from the Commission and notice of such will be communicated to the City of Columbus. After the third missed meeting, the secretary will remind the member of the attendance policy. After the fourth missed meeting, the secretary will remind the member about the need to submit a petition to the Chairperson if the member would like to maintain their position. Members shall, so far as possible, inform either the Chairperson or the Secretary, prior to the meeting, when they know they will be absent.
- 7. The Commission shall nominate one or more candidates to fill any vacancy caused by death, disqualification, or other means for the remainder of the unexpired term by letter to the Mayor pursuant to C.C. 3109 and the Department of Neighborhoods. When there is a vacancy, public notice will be made on the web site and/or emailed to the community member email list.

Article V. Officers

- 1. The officers of the Commission shall be: Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary and Fiscal Officer. At the first meeting of the Commission, officers shall be elected by majority vote of the members. Thereafter, election of officers shall be at the annual meeting. Officers shall serve one (1) year, or until a successor is elected. Each officer shall have the right to vote on any question. The Chairperson may serve no more than six (6) consecutive years but may be elected again after a gap of at least three (3) consecutive years. A Chairperson's six (6) year term may be extended by a majority vote of the Commission. This provision will be effective at the first annual meeting following the approval of this bylaw provision and the number of years the Chairperson has served will start being counted at the first annual meeting following the approval of this bylaw provision. An individual serving six (6) consecutive years as the Chairperson is not eligible to serve as any other officer of the Commission for three (3) consecutive years after their term as Chairperson expires. This individual is eligible to continue to serve as an area commissioner.
- 2. The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Commission; in consultation with other Commission members, appoint standing and special committees of the Commission; serve as an ex-officio member of all committees; coordinate the actions of officers and committee chairperson; and perform other duties associated with the office as required.
- 3. The Vice-Chairperson shall assist the Chairperson; perform all the duties of the Chairperson in his or her absence; and perform other such duties as may be assigned by the Commission.
- 4. The Secretary shall call and record roll; remind a member of his or her absences per Article IV, section 6; record and maintain accurate voting records and meeting summaries which shall be open to public examination; maintain such other records as the Commission may direct; notify the Mayor of any vacancy; perform related duties as may be assigned by the

3 of 7 As of July 21, 2020 Commission; and in the absence of both the Chairperson and the Vice-Chairperson, call the meeting to order and preside until the immediate election of a chairperson pro tempore.

- 5. The Fiscal Officer shall receive all funds and disburse all funds with the Commission's approval.
- 6. A vacancy in the office of the Chairperson shall be filled by the Vice-Chairperson. A vacancy in any other position shall be filled in the same manner as the original selection.

Article VI. Meeting

- 1. Regular meetings will be held monthly except for December on the third Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm. Meetings will occur in this manner unless otherwise directed by the majority vote of the Commission in sufficient time to notify constituents and the City Administration of such change. Each meeting shall be held in the Commission Area unless suitable facilities are not available in which they may seek suitable facilities contiguous to the Commission Area in an appropriate, large room convenient for members and the public chosen by the Commission as its regular meeting place, unless otherwise specified at least fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting. Notice of the meeting with an agenda shall be published in the City Bulletin prior to changing meeting time or location.
- 2. The annual meeting shall by the first regular meeting following the elections at which time new members will be seated and new officers elected.
- 3. Special meetings may be called by Executive Committee, the Chairperson, or by majority of the members in a regular or special meeting. The meeting's purpose, date, time, and location shall be stated when the meeting is called. No business will be considered at a special meeting unless it was stated when the meeting was called. Except in cases of emergency, three (3) days' notice shall be given for a special meeting.
- 4. All meetings shall be open to the public, and notice shall be published, when possible, at least seven (7) days in advance in a newspaper of general circulation in the Commission Area and on the web site and/or community member email list.
- 5. Quorum: A majority of the total membership shall constitute a quorum for conducting business.
- 7. The Order of Business can be determined by the Chair. A suggested format is:
 - 1. Pledge of Allegiance
 - 2. Roll Call
 - 3. Zoning
 - 4. Invited Guests
 - 5. Routine Business
 - 6. New Business
 - A. Reports
 - B. Announcements
 - 7. Old Business
 - 8. Adjournment
- 8. The Chairperson shall recognize members of the public who wish to address the Commission concerning issues under discussion. The Chairperson shall uniformly limit debate to an equal amount of time for each side of the issue. Time limits may be set by the Commission. When appropriate, further action on the issue may be deferred to the next Commission meeting.

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- 9. Dissenting or non-concurring reports may be filed with the Secretary by any Commission member and shall be attached to the majority report.
- 10. Individual citizens or Commissioners may be asked to research a specific topic and report findings to the Commission.
- 11. Meeting minutes shall be promptly prepared, shared with members of the Commission and voted on at the next regular meeting. Once approved the minutes shall be provided to the Department of Neighborhoods within thirty (30) days. Minutes shall be maintained and available to the public. They will be posted on the Commissions website and shared with the Columbus Metropolitan Library.

Article VII. Committees

- 1. The Chairperson shall appoint Commission members to standing committees giving due consideration to their individual preferences and subject to approval by a majority vote of the Commission members.
- 2. The Chairperson shall appoint non-members to Commission committees from recommendations by Commission members appointed to that particular committee subject to approval by a majority vote of the Commission members. Non-member appointees shall have full voting privileges in all proceedings of the committee to which they are appointed. The number of non-members on any committee shall not exceed the number of Commission members appointed.
- 3. Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the Chairperson and their appointments shall expire at the next annual meeting.
- 4. The Chairperson shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee.
- 5. After appointments are approved, the members of each committee shall select a Committee Chairperson from among the Commission members appointed to the committee.
- 6. Committees will be formed as needed.
- 7. Notice of all committee meetings and copies of all committee correspondence shall be filed with the Secretary and the Chairperson of the Commission. Committee findings which propose action or resolution shall be submitted at a regular meeting of the Commission for consideration.

Article VIII. Elections.

- 1. The Elections Board shall consist of a minimum of three (3) Commission Area residents appointed by the Chairperson with the approval of the Commission by the last regular meeting in April of each year. No individual running election night activities can be connected in any way with any candidate appearing on the ballot for the Commission. If no Elections Board is appointed, then all Commission members will make up the Elections Board.
- 2. The Board shall appoint any necessary officers; provide for printing and distributing necessary forms such as, but not limited to, petitions, ballots and tallies; receive petitions; certify persons who have qualified as candidates, locate polling places, conduct the election; tally the votes; hear and decide complaints concerning the election or campaign; and certify the winning candidates to the Commission pursuant to C.C. 3109 and the Selection Procedure, including all activities incidental thereto.
- 3. Candidates for selection shall not be polling staffs in year or years in which their names appear on the ballot.

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- 4. Elections shall be by secret ballot and determined by plurality of vote if three (3) or more candidates vie for a single position, otherwise a majority of votes cast shall elect. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older who is a resident of the Commission Area and the City of Columbus may be an elector. Electors need not be registered with the Franklin County Board of Elections. The initial election shall be conducted by a Task Force. Thereafter, each election shall be conducted by the Elections Board on the observance of "National Night Out" which is generally held on the first Tuesday in August. If "National Night Out" is delayed or does not take place by November 1st of each year, then the Elections Board will hold elections on the evening of the regular November meeting at the site of the regular meeting. Members shall take office at the next annual meeting.
- 5. The Election Board shall adopt Election Rules for governing the elections by majority vote of its members provided such rules shall conform with these Bylaws and Selection Procedure. Such rules shall not be changed during the ninety (90) days before an election nor thirty (30) days after an election. The adoption of amendment of such Rules shall be presented to the Commission at the beginning of a regular meeting. Should the Commission not disapprove of them prior to adjournment, such Rules take effect. The Commission may amend the Election Rules without action by the Elections Board in the same manner as an amendment of these Bylaws. If no election rules are presented before the time requirements listed previously the standing election rules will still apply with updated dates consistent with the prior election rules.
- 6. If the number of candidates is the same as, or less than, the number of available seats no election will be held.

Article IX. Parliamentary Authority

Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern in all cases to which they are applicable and not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the Commission may adopt.

Article X Public Records

- 1. The Commission shall identify a person responsible for maintaining all public records of the Commission.
- 2. All public records shall be retained for the applicable period of time specified by the records retention schedule for the Department of Neighborhoods. Public records include, but are not limited to, official meeting minutes, agendas, election materials, zoning application packets, tape or video recordings of meetings and other correspondence.
- 3. The Commission's records shall be organized and maintained in a manner that records shall be promptly prepared and made available for inspection to any person.

Article XI Code of Conduct

- 1. Area Commissioners shall conduct themselves in a professional and civil manner. Harassment, intimidation, or discrimination, as defined in Columbus City Code 2331, in any form will not be tolerated.
- Area Commissioners shall treat other area commissioners developers, and member of the public with respect and
 consideration regardless of the other's opinion, income, homeowner status, renter status, political affiliation, race,
 sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability,
 familial status or military status.
- 3. Area Commissioners, their family members, or business associates shall not benefit financially as a result of their duties as an area commissioner or present the appearance of impropriety as a result of said duties. Area Commissioners shall fully disclose to their area commission, at the earliest opportunity, information that may result in perceived or actual conflict of interest. Area commissioners shall recuse themselves from all participation in any matters involving a conflict of interest on behalf of said commissioner.
- 4. Failure of the Commission to abide by these adopted bylaws may result in the withholding of funding, the postponement of meetings and operations, or the exclusion of recommendations and actions to other bodies.

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Article XII. Amendments of Bylaws

These Bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Commission by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Commission Members provided that the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting. The Secretary shall file any approved amendment immediately after its adoption with the City Clerk for publication in the City Bulletin. Such amendment shall take effect ten (10) days after such publication per C.C. 121.05.
