

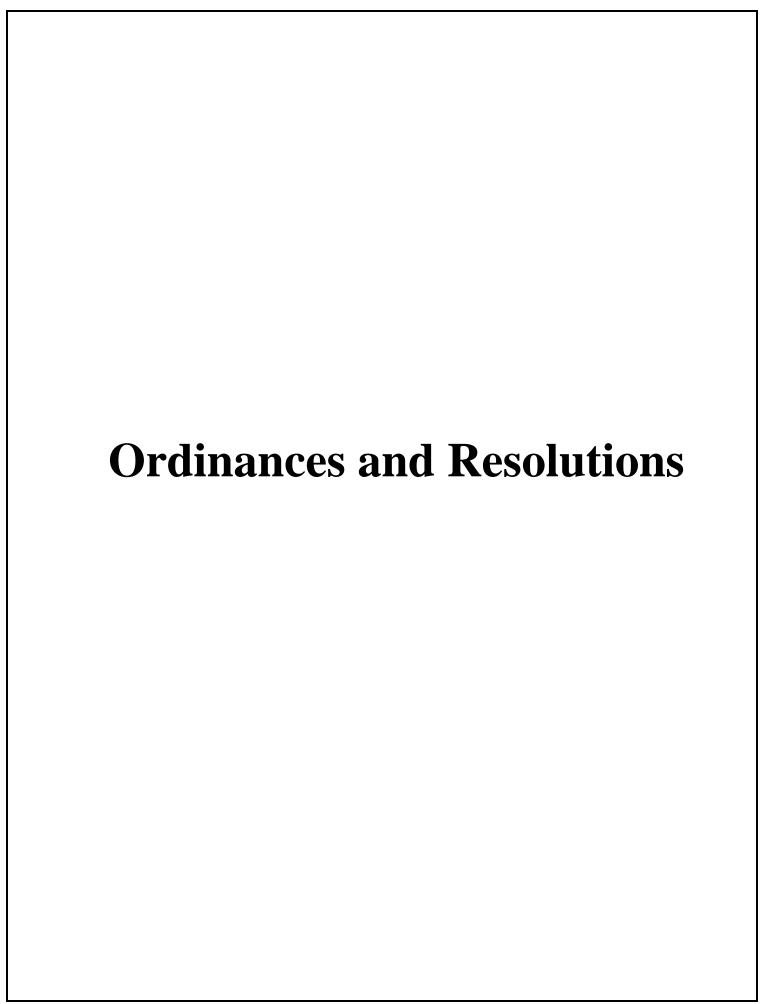

To Designate March 2023 as "National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month"

WHEREAS, while colorectal diagnosis and death rates have been declining for the past decade due to a concerted push for increased screening, it remains the second leading cause of cancer deaths within the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, as reported by National Cancer Institute, there were 151,030 estimated cases of colorectal cancer in 2023, of which about 52,580 resulted in a fatality; and

WHEREAS, it is particularly important for vulnerable communities to become aware since disparities in colorectal cancer screenings can lead to higher rates of death for these populations; and

All public performances of music, whether live, recorded or broadcast, must be licensed through either ASCAP, BMI, SESAC or GMR. The City holds a municipal license which covers events at facilities owned and/or operated by the city and any site engaged by the city for use by the city. In addition to Recreation and Parks' programs and facilities, coverage is extended to: Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration, Columbus Commons productions, Veterans' Day Parade, King Arts Complex, Lincoln Theatre, Franklin Park Conservatory, Columbus Zoo and all other city conducted programs and facilities that play or present music. Recreation and Parks will expend \$30,000 for annual licenses.

A grant process for community events and festivals has existed since 1995 to support community groups and neighbors that host free events celebrating cultural, ethnic, and artistic diversity for the entertainment and enjoyment by the greater Columbus community. Through the grant application process the department will solicit funding requests for the following categories; First Time Impact, Neighborhood Impact, Community Impact, Citywide Impact, and Regional Impact. Established City processes (C.C. 111.14 & 329) shall be followed to expend \$180,000 of Hotel Motel funding on sponsorship grants to a number of local not-for-profit organizations that will be determined through a documented and open grant application and committee award process. All grants shall be in support of community events held on public property using main account 65026 - Tax

Reportable Grants to Others. No individual grant agreement shall exceed \$50,000.00. Grants shall be paid out to awardees in advance. All grantees must meet the "community events and festivals" requirements under C.C. 371.02.

The Department will expend \$35,000 of the allocated Hotel Motel funding to produce the 42nd annual Jazz & Rib Fest- one of the region's largest free jazz festivals.

Areas Affected (Areas/Communities being affected by this project): All quadrants of the City where community groups and neighbors that host free events that celebrate cultural, ethnic, & artistic diversity for the entertainment and enjoyment by the greater Columbus Community.

Terry's team serves the Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Toledo and Youngstown markets through buying, selling and leasing commercial properties. The company's commercial portfolio include offices, industrial warehouses, and manufacturing spaces as well as land and investment opportunities.

The Enterprise is proposing to invest a total project cost of approximately \$17,146,315.00 in real property improvements to construct a Class A proactive industrial facility totaling approximately 270,000 square feet on a vacant land parcel consisting of approximately 13.6 +/- acres (the "Facility") at 885 Stelzer Road, Columbus, Ohio 43219, parcel number 010-146738 (the "Project Site"). The Enterprise anticipates that the development will create of cause to be created thirty (30) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1,134,000.00 at the proposed Project Site ("New Employees").

The Director of the Department of Development is recommending that Council approve a 75%/10-year Enterprise Zone tax abatement on real property improvements made by the Enterprise at the **Project Site**, in consideration of it creating, or causing to be created, the New Employees.

WHERAS, the Enterprise has submitted a proposal ("Proposal") to invest approximately \$17.14 million in real

property improvements (the "Project") to construct an approximately 207,000 square-foot Class A proactive industrial facility (the "Facility") at 885 Stelzer Road, Columbus, Ohio, 43219, identified as parcel number 010-146738 (the "Project Site"). The Enterprise anticipates that the Project will create or cause to be created thirty (30) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated new annual payroll of approximately \$1,134,000.00 ("New Employees"); and

WHEREAS, after reviewing and investigating the Proposal submitted by the Enterprise, the Director of the Department of Development believes that the Enterprise has demonstrated that it is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the Columbus Enterprise Zone and improve the City's economic climate; and

WHEREAS, contingent upon the successful sale and transfer of ownership of title to the Enterprise, which would include the aforementioned **Project Site**, the Director of the Department of Development is recommending that City Council approve a 10-year, 75% abatement on the assessed valuation of the Project Site due to construction of the \$17.14 million addition, to incentivize the Enterprise to construct the Class A proactive industrial facility in the City's Northeast corridor; and

SECTION 4. Contingent upon the successful sale and transfer of ownership of title to the Enterprise, which would include the aforementioned **Project Site**, the Director of the Department of Development, for and in the name of the City, is authorized to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement with the Enterprise in a form substantially similar to the one attached hereto as Exhibit "A" with such changes, amendments or edits thereto, that are not inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance, or adverse to the City. This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into an agreement with the National Center for Water Quality Research (NCWQR) at Heidelberg University to provide funding for the continued operation of the water quality tributary loading monitoring station on the Scioto River at Chillicothe. This operation will be conducted in collaboration with the Division of Sewerage and Drainage (DOSD) and includes intensive sampling, analysis of suspended sediments, and the calculation of the separate contributions of point-source and

nonpoint-source loads of phosphorus and other pollutants in the Scioto River watershed upstream of the station. The first phase of this work was completed during calendar years 2014 through 2016, with a second phase running from calendar years 2017 through 2021. This third phase will occur during calendar years 2022 through 2026.

The NCWQR, founded in 1969 by Dr. David B. Baker, is a research organization within the science departments of Heidelberg University in Tiffin, Ohio. The Heidelberg Tributary Loading Program (HTLP) began in 1974 and added the Scioto River monitoring station at Chillicothe in 1996. Presently there are 22 stations in the HTLP in Ohio and southeastern Michigan, which permit the calculation of pollutant loads from over 50% of Ohio's land area. The NCWQR uses information from these stations to calculate the loads of nutrients, sediments, and pesticides delivered to Lake Erie and the Ohio River. The HTLP receives funding from a combination of state and federal agencies, foundations, industries, individuals through research grants, and contract or well test analyses. All of the resulting data, including those for the Scioto River Loading Station, are publicly available at the HTLP website.

Measurements of pollutant export from watersheds are used to compare the amount of pollutants derived from diffuse *nonpoint* sources, such as agricultural and urban storm runoff, with contributions from *point* sources, such as publicly owned wastewater treatment plants and industrial facilities. The City of Columbus wastewater treatment plants are the two largest point-source dischargers into the Scioto River watershed. Accordingly, collecting pollutant monitoring data in the Scioto River watershed to compare Columbus discharges with those from other pollutant sources is of significant interest to the City.

In operating the Chillicothe monitoring station, NCWQR will obtain the best available data on point-source loads to the Scioto River upstream of the monitoring station, compute the proportional contributions of point-source and nonpoint-source loads of total phosphorus and other pollutants of interest to DOSD. NCWQR will upload the data to the HTLP portal and coordinate with DOSD personnel to analyze dissolved organic carbon in a subset of samples collected at the Chillicothe station during both base flow and storm runoff events.

The work for this third phase of the agreement will occur during calendar years 2022 through 2026 and will continue as an annual ongoing contract. The cost estimate for calendar year 2023 operations is a not-to-exceed amount of \$45,000.00. Funding requested for future years will be based upon budgeted funds and approval by City Council.

BACKGROUND: The City's Recreation and Parks Department ("CRPD") is engaged in the FRA-Olentangy Trail/Clinton Como Project, PID 112036 ("Public Project"). The Olentangy Trail is Central Ohio's most heavily

used greenway trail. Recent trail count data shows over 4 million trail miles per year are traveled on this path.

In 2018, Recreation and Parks applied for and received \$ 5,417,132 in grant funding from the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission to construct the final gap of the 14 mile Olentangy Trail, from Northmoor Park to Clinton

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Como Park. This central 0.6 mile segment of the trail between Northmoor Park and Clinton Como Park was never completed, and users must leave the trail and use a 1 mile signed on-street route which travels on 5 different streets. The route is widely recognized as difficult to navigate, congested, narrow, and unsafe. The route includes constricted sections where combined two-way car and trail traffic is on 11'-13' wide pavement.

This project will complete this final trail gap by constructing a crossing of the Olentangy River at Northmoor Park and travel along the west bank of the river. At North Broadway the trail will use an enhanced bike and pedestrian crosswalk and signal and travel along the river behind the Ohio Health campus on North Broadway. The trail will then continue south and cross the river to Clinton Como Park, where it rejoins the existing trail.

As part of the grant funding, Recreation and Parks is responsible to acquire any necessary permanent and temporary easements to construct the trail project. The City must acquire in good faith and accept certain fee simple title and lesser real estate located between Northmoor Park to Clinton Como Park Columbus, Ohio 43214 (collectively, "Real Estate"). Accordingly, CRPD requested the City Attorney to acquire the Real Estate in good faith and contract for associated professional services (e.g. surveys, title work, appraisals, etc.) in order for CRPD to timely complete the acquisition of the property.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: Not applicable.

BACKGROUND: The Director of the Department of Development is requesting authorization to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement on behalf of the City with 0 Outerbelt Street, LLC (and also the "Enterprise"). The Ohio Enterprise Zone law Section 5709.62(C) of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the City to enter into Council-approved tax abatement agreements between the City and qualifying companies.

0 Outerbelt Street, LLC is a partnership comprised of three members of Crawford Hoying who will serve as the sponsor entity that invests directly in and oversees the development of the project. Crawford Hoying, established in 2012, is one of the largest real estate development firms in the Columbus region. Over the past decade, Crawford Hoying has successfully completed projects at more than \$1 billion statewide.

0 Outerbelt Street, LLC is proposing to invest a total project cost of approximately \$30,444,390.00, which includes \$7,000,000.00 in acquisition cost and \$23,444,390.00 in real property improvements to construct an approximately 205,000 square-foot Class A proactive industrial facility ("Facility") at Outerbelt Street Columbus, Ohio 43213, on four contiguous parcel numbers 520-143653, 520-143654, 520-143655 and 520-308803 (the "Project Site"). The Enterprise anticipates that the project will create or cause to be created twenty-five (25) net, new full-time permanent positions with an estimated new annual payroll of approximately \$1,040,000.00 at the Project Site ("New Employees").

The Director of the Department of Development is recommending that Council approve a 75%/10-year Enterprise Zone tax abatement on real property improvements made by the Enterprise at the **Project Site**, in consideration of it creating, or causing to be created, the New Employees.

The Gahanna-Jefferson City School District and Eastland-Fairfield Joint Vocational School District have been advised of this project.

This legislation is presented as 30-day legislation.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No funding is required for this legislation.

WHEREAS, 0 Outerbelt Street, LLC (the "Enterprise") is a partnership comprised of three members of Crawford Hoying, a real estate development company. Crawford Hoying, established in 2012, is one of the largest real estate development firms in the Columbus region. Over the past decade, Crawford Hoying has

successfully completed projects in Ohio with a combined value of more than \$1 billion; and

WHEREAS, the Enterprise has submitted a proposal ("Proposal") to invest approximately \$23.44 million in real property improvements (the "Project") to construct an approximately 205,000 square-foot Class A proactive industrial facility (the "Facility") at Outerbelt Street Columbus, Ohio 43213, on four contiguous parcel numbers 520-143653, 520-143654, 520-143655 and 520-308803 (the "Project Site"). The Enterprise anticipates that the Project will create 25 net, new full-time permanent positions at the Facility with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1,040,000.00 ("New Employees"); and

WHEREAS, after reviewing and investigating the Proposal submitted by the Enterprise, the Director of the Department of Development believes that the Enterprise has demonstrated that it is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the Columbus Enterprise Zone and improve the City's economic climate; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Development is recommending that City Council approve a 10-year, 75% abatement on the assessed valuation of the Project Site due to construction of the \$23.44 million Facility, to incentivize the Enterprise to construct the Class A industrial facility in the City's eastern corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Development Director has notified the Gahanna-Jefferson City School District and Eastland-Fairfield Joint Vocational School District of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into an agreement with the Enterprise in order to incentivize economic growth and create employment opportunities for its citizens, and for the preservation of public health, peace, property and safety.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

- SECTION 1. That Columbus City Council, having reviewed the proposal, finds that the Enterprise is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the City of Columbus Enterprise Zone and improve the City's economic climate pursuant to Revised Code Section 5709.62(C).
- SECTION 2. That City Council finds and determines (1) that the Enterprise will create, or cause to be created, the New Employee positions in the State and City; (2) that the Project is economically sound and will benefit the people of the State and City by increasing opportunities for employment and strengthening the economy of the State and City; and (3) that receiving the aforementioned tax abatement is a critical factor in the decision by representatives for 0 Outerbelt Street, LLC, the Enterprise hereunder, to go forward with constructing the Project.
- SECTION 3. Based on this determination, City Council approves and authorizes a 10-year, 75% abatement on the increase in assessed valuation of real property on the **Project Site**, contingent upon the Enterprise investing approximately \$23,444,390.00 in real property improvements by

constructing an approximately 205,000 square-foot Class A proactive industrial facility at Outerbelt Street, Columbus, Ohio 43213, on four contiguous parcel numbers 520-143653, 520-143654, 520-143655, and 520-308803, and the creation twenty-five (25) net, new full-time permanent positions at the **Project Site** with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1,040,000.00.

SECTION 4. The Director of the Department of Development, for and in the name of the City, is authorized to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement with the Enterprise in a form substantially similar to the one attached hereto as Exhibit "A" with such changes, amendments or edits thereto, that are not inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance, or adverse to the City. Such authorized amendment includes assignment of the Agreement from the Enterprise to a Related Member as defined in R.C. Section 5709.61(W), or to a Successor Enterprise as defined by R.C. Section 5709.61(Y). The Director of the Department of Development also is authorized to execute any other agreements or sign any documents necessary to effectuate the Agreement and the Exemption provided therein, and approved as to Form by the City Attorney, if required.

SECTION 5. That the City and the Enterprise must execute the attached Enterprise Zone Agreement within ninety (90) days of this Ordinance's passage, or this Ordinance, and the authorization to enter into the tax abatement agreement, is null and void.

BACKGROUND: The Office of CelebrateOne has been awarded a grant from Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services (FCDJFS) with \$400,000.00 originating from the US Department of Health and Human Services (G402301) and \$400,000.00 from FCDJFS general fund (G402302). This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$800,000.00 in grant monies for (1) communication and marketing campaigns designed to encourage safe sleep practices and to increase enrollment in home visiting services; (2) neighborhood initiatives focused on teen reproductive health education; and (3) safe sleep survival kits with cribs for the period of October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

On average, one baby dies every other week in Franklin County due to unsafe sleep practices. Many of these deaths could be prevented by following the ABCs of infant safe sleep - that babies should sleep Alone, on their Backs, and in an empty Crib, every night, every nap, every time. The allocated funding will help in the efforts to reduce sleep related deaths in Franklin County through an educational marketing campaign, to increase enrollment in home visiting services, to fund the Columbus Health Department's Cribs for Kids program which

distributes cribs for families in need, and to implement neighborhood initiatives focused on teen reproductive health education.

This ordinance is submitted as an emergency so as to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the city's accounting system as soon as possible, given the grant start date of October 1, 2022. Up to date financial posting promotes accurate accounting and financial management.

A Request for Proposals for the Safe Sleep communications and marketing services will be publicly advertised in February and March 2023, with an awarded contract legislated separately from this ordinance. Teen health education services will be legislated in separate ordinances once the providers are determined. Columbus Public Health Department will encumber up to \$70,000.00 for their Cribs for Kids Program from this grant.

FISCAL IMPACT: The program is funded by Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services and the US Department of Health and Human Services.

To authorize the Executive Director of CelebrateOne to accept a grant from Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services to implement a series of initiatives including a safe sleep communications and marketing campaign, neighborhood initiatives focused on teen reproductive health education, and a crib distribution program with Columbus Public Health Department; to authorize the appropriation of \$800,000.00 within the General Government Grants Fund; and to declare an emergency. (\$800,000.00)

WHEREAS, \$800,000.00 in grant funds have been made available to the Office of CelebrateOne through the Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services for safe sleep and neighborhood initiatives focused on teen health education; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is submitted as an emergency so as to allow the financial transaction to be posted in the city's accounting system as soon as possible due to the grant begin date of October 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to appropriate the grant funding up to \$800,000.00; and

WHEREAS, up-to-date financial posting promotes accurate accounting and financial management; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of Columbus Public Health and the Mayor's CelebrateOne Program in that it is immediately necessary to authorize Executive Director of CelebrateOne to accept this grant from Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services, and to appropriate these funds within the General Government Fund 2220 for CelebrateOne's programs for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace, property, safety, and welfare; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. The Office of CelebrateOne and Columbus Public Health have been awarded a grant from the Ohio Department of Health. This ordinance is to accept and appropriate \$722,375.00 in grant money to fund the Ohio Equity Initiative 2.0 for the period January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023. This project will allow CelebrateOne to focus on nine zip codes in Franklin County with the greatest potential to impact the birth outcomes of pregnant African-American women at risk for preterm and low birth weights in Franklin County. It will also cover the Fetal Infant Mortality Review community based program that identifies local infant mortality issues and develops recommendations and initiatives to reduce infant deaths.

Funds will cover a percentage of the costs of the team managing the project - Senior Program Manager, Assistant Program Manager, Epidemiologist, and Health Equity Manager. In addition, funding will cover other operational expenses including but not limited to: office supplies, outreach materials, professional development, and mileage reimbursement.

<u>Emergency Measure</u>: This ordinance is submitted as an emergency to continue support of all activities for the Ohio Equity Initiative within the Columbus Public Health Department and the Office of CelebrateOne.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Ohio Equity Initiative 2.0 is entirely funded by the grant from the Ohio Department of Health and does not generate revenue or require a City Match. Grant number 402300.

To authorize the Executive Director, Office of CelebrateOne, and Columbus Public Health, to accept a grant from the Ohio Department of Health in the amount of \$722,375.00 for the Ohio Equity Initiative 2.0 Project through December 31, 2023; to authorize the appropriation and expenditure of up to \$722,375.00 from the City's General Government Grant Fund to cover a percentage of the costs of the team managing the project and to cover other operational expenses including but not limited to: office supplies, outreach materials, professional development, and mileage reimbursement; and to declare an emergency. The LPA further agrees that change orders and extra work contracts required to fulfill the construction contracts shall be processed as needed. The State shall not approve a change order or extra work contract until it first gives notice, in writing, to the LPA. The LPA shall contribute its share of the cost of these items in accordance with other sections herein.

The LPA further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost to install and/or repair curb ramps at all necessary intersections to ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

SECTION 4 - MAINTENANCE

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described Project; (3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION 5 - AUTHORITY TO SIGN

SWACO tipping fee rates are determined by SWACO's established rate-setting process. Due to an existing contractual relationship where the City of Columbus participates in the rate-setting process, the City is required to use SWACO waste disposal services. The existing contract for radiation remediation was created using a competitive bidding process and resulted in a one-year contract with the option of renewing for three additional years. The Department of Public service would like to extend this contract utilizing year three.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

This expense is budgeted and appropriated within the Department of Public Service, within the Division of Refuse Collection General Fund.

3. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION

Emergency action is requested to avoid delays of payment to SWACO that could result in the city incurring interest penalties as specified within the contract.

WEST SCIOTO AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Disapproval Approval.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The site consists of one 5.20± acre parcel developed with a 58,501± square foot commercial shopping center zoned in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District. The requested Council variance will permit the site to be redeveloped with a mixed-use development containing 235 apartment units, including ground floor residential units, and 1,829 square feet of commercial space. A Council variance is necessary because ground floor residential uses are not permitted in the CPD district. The site is located within the boundaries of the *Trabue/Roberts Area Plan* (2011), which recommends "Mixed-use (Community)" land uses at this location, and includes early adoption of the *Columbus Citywide Planning Policies* (C2P2) Design Guidelines (2018). The West Scioto Area Commission conditioned support on prohibiting northwest bound right turns at the intersection to the west of the proposed Building B. The Department of Public Service is not supportive of establishing a regulatory sign that would prohibit right turns at this intersection where such a prohibition does not address a safety issue, therefore that condition has not been met. The requested variance will allow a mixed use development that is not considered to be an introduction of an incompatible use, and is consistent with the Plan's land use recommendation.

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Section 3361.02, Permitted uses; 3356.05(F)(1), C-4 district development limitations; and Section 3361.03, Development plan, for the property located at 3755-3799 **RIDGE MILL DR. (43026)**, to permit ground floor residential uses as part of a mixed-use development in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District (Council Variance #CV22-100).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-100, the owner of property at 3755-3799 RIDGE MILL DR. (43026), is requesting a Council variance to permit a mixed-use development containing 235 apartment units, including

ground floor residential units, and 1,829 square feet of commercial space in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3361.02, Permitted uses, prohibits ground floor residential units, while the applicant proposes to redevelop the site with a mixed-use development containing ground floor residential units; and

WHEREAS, Section 3356.05(F)(1), C-4 district development limitations, requires that first-floor parking garages with dwelling units above must be connected/adjoined to commercial uses that occupy the entire length of at least one property frontage, while the applicant proposes adjoining commercial uses to occupy less than the entire length of the building's Ridge Mill Drive frontage; and

WHEREAS, Section 3361.03, Development plan, reports the overall concept of a proposed development, which for this property specifically permits all uses permitted in the C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4, and C-5, Commercial districts, none of which permit ground floor residential units, while the applicant proposes to redevelop the site with a mixed-use development containing ground floor residential units; and

WHEREAS, the West Scioto Area Commission recommends disapproval; and

WHEREAS, City Departments Recommend approval because the requested variance will allow a mixed-use development containing ground floor residential units that is not considered to be an introduction of an incompatible use, nor is it inconsistent with the "Mixed-use (Community)" land use recommendation of the *Trabue/Roberts Area Plan*; and

Emergency Designation: Emergency designation will ensure timely payments to FCEMHS for operational purposes and avoid disruption in services.

FISCAL IMPACT: This ordinance authorizes an expenditure of \$884,505.99 from the 2023 General Fund operating budget for the administration of the Franklin County Emergency Management and Homeland Security program, including expenses for the administration of the countywide mass notification system. The majority of this year's funds, \$794,505.99, represents operational and administrative support activities including the mass notification system, and \$90,000.00 represents maintenance costs for the outdoor warning sirens. The city spent \$834,336.99 on the FCEMHS Program in 2022, \$811,436.77 in 2021, \$811,474.04 in 2020 and \$793,267.05 in 2019.

The CPD text commits to a site plan and includes development standards addressing setbacks, site access, landscaping, building design, lighting, and graphics commitments. Included in the text are code modifications to eliminate parking lot and certain perimeter landscaping, allow internal drive aisles, and reduce the minimum numbers of parking spaces required from 492 to 374. The site is located within the boundaries of the *Interim Hayden Run Corridor Plan* (2004), which recommends "Community Commercial" and "Neighborhood Center" land uses at this location, which primarily supports multi-unit residential and commercial uses. Additionally, the Plan includes adoption of the *Columbus Citywide Planning Policies (C2P2) Design Guidelines* (2018). C2P2 Design Guidelines recommend that buildings be

parallel to and facing the street with entrance doors connected to the public sidewalk network, using high quality, durable materials, and ground floor uses that address the street. The Plan states that open space should be integrated into new developments, serving as an organizational element or a central green space and that structured parking be considered for mixed-use projects with bicycle parking beyond what is provided by code be provided, and parking lots hidden from view. The requested CPD, Commercial Planned Development District will allow a mixed-use development that is compatible with the development standards of adjacent developments. The proposal is consistent with the land use recommendations of the Plan and with C2P2 Design Guidelines. - 1. The building setback shall be a minimum of fifteen (15) feet along Avery Road, and the parking setback shall be a minimum of zero feet along the northern, southern, and eastern boundaries of the site.
- 2. Notwithstanding the foregoing paragraphs, no building or parking setback shall be required from any property line that is created within and internal to the total site such that the parcel created continues to function as part of the overall site.
- 3. Maximum height of buildings shall be 60 feet.
- 4. There shall be a maximum, aggregate commercial building square footage for this Site of 47,900 including a club house/amenity center and leasing office, and not including ancillary patio seating. There shall be a maximum of 364 residential units.

B. Access, Loading, Parking and/or Other Traffic Related Commitments.

- 1. Access shall be as depicted on the attached CPD Site Plan.
- 2. The exact location of access points as shown on the CPD Site Plan may be modified subject to the review and approval of the City's Department of Public Service without the need for rezoning.
- 3. Internal drive aisles may be developed without regard to interior parcel lines, such that the parcels function seamlessly as part of the overall site. Cross-access easements will be provided.
- 4. Parking for the Site may be calculated on an aggregate basis.
- 5. The Owner/Developer agrees to construct a traffic signal at the intersection of Riggins Road and Basinghall Road with this proposed development.

C. Buffering, Landscaping, Open Space and/or Screening Commitments.

- 1. All open areas on each developed parcel not occupied by buildings, structures, outside display areas, parking areas, street right-of-way paved areas, driveways, signs, walkways, and off-street loading areas shall be landscaped with lawns, grasses, seasonal plantings, mulch, trees, or shrubs.
- 2. The frontage along Avery Road shall include street trees spaced one per 40 feet. In addition, there shall be a minimum 2-foot-high earth mound, which may undulate, and shall include additional plantings of 3 ornamental trees and 2 deciduous trees for every 100 feet of frontage, which trees may be evenly spaced or grouped. Vehicular access points along Avery Road, shall include shrubs and seasonal plantings.
- 3. Applicant has provided a significant setback / green belt for the area south of the Site. No additional landscaping shall be required pursuant to CCC 3312 or 3321.

D. Building Design and/or Interior-Exterior Treatment Commitments.

The appearance and architecture of the main commercial shopping center and any multi-tenant buildings greater than 10,000 square feet (not including outlot buildings) shall be consistent and compatible throughout. Building materials for all buildings shall be primarily of brick, brick veneer, stone or stucco stone, metal, stucco, synthetic stucco (EIFS), wood, vinyl, and glass. No exposed or painted concrete block shall be permitted. Commercial decorative finish to block may be used for the sides and rear of buildings, not fronting to streets.

E. Lighting, Outdoor Display Areas, and/or other Environmental Commitments.

- 1. Light poles and lights shall be black, dark brown or bronze in color and coordinated with the overall architectural scheme for the subarea.
- 2. Light poles shall have a maximum height of 28 feet, however light poles within 50 feet of a residentially zoned property shall be limited to 14 feet in height.

F. Graphics and/or Signage Commitments.

- 1. The Developer may submit a graphics plan for part or all of this development. If no graphics plan is submitted, all signage and graphics shall conform to Chapter 3372 as pertains to the C-4 district and the Regional Commercial Overlay, and the design standards set forth in this text. Any variance to the standards of this text or Columbus City Code shall be submitted to the Columbus Graphics Commission.
- 2. The exterior appearance of monument signage bases and / or framing shall be compatible with the architecture of the buildings and structures within the subarea to create a cohesive appearance throughout the subarea. All ground signs shall be monument style with masonry bases constructed of stone, stone veneer, brick, brick veneer, stucco, or stucco stone, or otherwise match the architectural material of the buildings on the same lot.
- 3. The prior zoning (Z14-010; 2733-2015) provided for three monument ground signs (two along Riggins Road, one for Avery Road) to be permitted for the main commercial shopping center south of Hayden's Crossing Boulevard. This Site contains only the single monument sign along Avery Road frontage, which shall remain the same. This CPD does not impact the remaining lands or the two monument signs along the Riggins Road frontage. Outparcels and commercial development north of Riggins Road are not impacted in this CPD, and thus continue to have code permitted signage consistent with the standards set forth herein.

- 4. Any illuminated signs shall be internally illuminated or may be externally illuminated if focused only on the sign. Ground mounted external illumination, if used, shall be screened with landscaping.
- 5. No pole signs shall be permitted.

G. Miscellaneous Commitments.

- 1. There shall be multiple points of pedestrian connectivity to/among other subareas and to the adjacent streets and sidewalks. There shall be an interconnected system of paths and sidewalks throughout the development. Where provided, such pedestrian connections shall be a minimum of 5 feet in width. Sidewalks and/or multi-use paths shall be provided on both sides of all streets (not alleys or drive aisles), and also be a minimum of 5 feet in width. Where pedestrian paths and sidewalks cross internal drive aisles or streets, striped cross walks shall be provided. Final locations of all aisles, paths, sidewalks, and roads/alleys, etc., to be determined at the time of final engineering.
- 2. The developer has fully complied with the parkland dedication ordinance from the prior zoning Z14-010/ ORD #2733-2015.
- 3. All new wiring shall be underground.
- 4. The proposed development shall be developed in general conformance with the submitted CPD Site Plan. The plan may be adjusted to reflect engineering, topographical or other site data developed at the time that development and engineering plans are completed. Streets, are schematic and along with parking, subject to minor change. Any adjustment to the Site Plan shall be reviewed and may be approved by the Director of the Department of Building & Zoning Services or his designee upon submission of the appropriate data regarding the proposed adjustment.

H. Other CPD Requirements

- 1. Natural Environment: The property is located along Avery Road (the Site's west boundary) and Riggins Road.
- 2. Existing Land Use: The property currently is agricultural.
- 3. Circulation: All access for the Site will be approved by the City of Columbus, Public Service Department.
- 4. Visibility: Consideration has been given to the visibility and safety of the motorists and pedestrians as both on and off the subject property in the development of this site.
- 5. Proposed Development: Commercial mixed-use development.
- 6. Behavior Patterns: Significant residential development in the area has brought about the need for commercial uses to service the existing residential population.
- 7. Emissions: No adverse effect from emissions should result from the proposed development.

I. Modifications to Development Standards Requested:

The following modifications to development standards are requested:

- 1. C.C.C. §3312.21 and 3321.09 to eliminate parking lot and certain perimeter landscaping.
- 2. C.C.C. §3312.25 to allow internal drive aisles to be developed without regard to interior parcel lines.
- 3. C.C.C. §3312.49 to reduce commercial parking from 492 to 374 spaces.
- 4. C.C.C. §3356.03 to allow residential units on the first floor of commercial (per concurrent CV22-063).
- 5. Additional variances to Zoning Code standards may be requested from the City of Columbus Board of Zoning Adjustment.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

PROPOSED USE: Mixed-use development.

CITY DEPARTMENTS' RECOMMENDATION: Approval. The applicant has received a recommendation of approval from Staff and the Development Commission for a concurrent rezoning (Ordinance #0588-2023; Z22-051) to the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District, which will permit a mixed-use development. The requested Council variance will permit ground-floor residential units and accessory residential uses. While commercial districts permit apartment units above ground-floor commercial uses, a Council variance is necessary to permit residential uses on the first floor. The request is comparable to recent mixed-use development projects in regional commercial areas, and is consistent with the "Community Commercial" and "Neighborhood Center" land use recommendations of the *Interim Hayden Run Corridor Plan* (2004).

To grant a Variance from the provisions of Sections 3356.03, C-4 permitted uses; and 3361.02, Permitted uses, of the Columbus City Codes; for the property located at **5191 RIGGINS RD. (43016)**, to permit ground-floor residential uses as part of a mixed-use residential development in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District (Council Variance #CV22-063).

WHEREAS, by application #CV22-063, the owner of property at **5191 RIGGINS RD. (43016)**, is requesting a Council variance to permit ground-floor residential uses as part of a mixed-use development in the CPD, Commercial Planned Development District; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance #0588-2023 (Rezoning Application #Z22-051), Section 3356.03, C-4 Permitted uses, is utilized to identify the specific uses permitted in the proposed CPD, Commercial Planned Development District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3356.03, C-4 permitted uses, does not permit ground floor residential uses, while the applicant proposes to permit such uses; and

This contract consists of repairing and resurfacing 59 city streets and constructing 197 ADA curb ramps along those streets. The work for which consists of: milling the existing pavement, overlaying with new asphalt concrete, minor curb replacement, and replacing curb and sidewalk associated with installing ADA wheelchair ramps. Where warranted, the plans also call for areas of full depth pavement repair, and other work as may be necessary to complete the contract in accordance with the plans and specifications set forth in the Bid Submittal Documents.

The estimated Notice to Proceed date is April 20, 2023. The project was let by the Office of Support Services through Vendor Services and Bid Express. Four bids were received on February 7, 2023, (all majority) and tabulated as follows:

Award is to be made to Kokosing Construction Company, Inc. as the lowest responsive and responsible and best bidder for their bid of \$8,958,265.48. The amount of construction administration and inspection services will be \$806,243.89. The total legislated amount is \$9,764,509.37.

Searches in the System for Award Management (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against Kokosing Construction Company, Inc.

2. CONTRACT COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

The contract compliance number for Kokosing Construction Company, Inc. is CC004610 and expires 3/3/24.

3. PRE-OUALIFICATION STATUS

Kokosing Construction Company, Inc. and all proposed subcontractors have met code requirements with respect to pre-qualification, pursuant to relevant sections of Columbus City Code Chapter 329.

4. FISCAL IMPACT

Budget authority for this 2023 resurfacing project is in the 2022 Capital Improvement Budget and cash for the resurfacing work is expected to be in the 2022 Bond Sale. The funds will not be available to Public Service until the proceeds of the 2022 bond sale are available. Therefore, it is necessary to certify funds in the amount of \$9,764,509.37 against the Special Income Tax Fund, Fund 4430. An amendment to the 2022 Capital Improvements Budget is required to match cash received from the Special Income Tax Fund and also to establish sufficient budget authority for this project. Funds will need to be appropriated within the Special Income Tax fund and then transferred to the Streets and Highways Bond Fund where they will also need to be appropriated.

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Service requires funding to be available for the Resurfacing 2023 Project 1 project for construction expense along with construction administration and inspection services; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the 2022 Capital Improvement Budget to establish authority within the correct project; and

BACKGROUND: The Public Safety Department entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Franklin County for the receipt of wireless 9-1-1 Government Assistance Funds as authorized by Ordinance 0042-2010 in January 2010. The wireless 9-1-1 fund was established due to the State of Ohio passing SB 361 which enacted a service charge of 28 cents per month for each wireless telephone number in the State of Ohio. Therefore, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 307.15, this ordinance authorizes the Director of Public Safety to renew an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Columbus and Franklin County concerning wireless 9-1-1 Funds (Governmental Assistance Funds). Franklin County is responsible for the distribution of the Wireless 9-1-1 Government Assistance Funds received from the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio and from the Ohio Department of Taxation beginning January 1, 2020.

Ohio Revised Code Section 128.57 allows for the continuation of a monthly fee billed to each wireless telephone number in the State of Ohio. The wireless service providers are required to bill for, collect, and remit the charges to the state, which, in turn distributes the proceeds to the eighty-eight counties in Ohio. The proceeds are disbursed to various jurisdictions based on the number of wireless service subscribers in the county. The funds are to pay for the subdivision's equipment and personnel costs of the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) providing the wireless enhanced 9-1-1 system, including call taking and dispatching operations. The City of Columbus is one of five PSAP agencies to receive funds from the proceeds in Franklin County.

Emergency Designation: Emergency legislation is necessary to receive proceeds of the award in the shortest possible time.

FISCAL IMPACT: The City of Columbus is the largest PSAP in Franklin County by population and by virtue of receiving approximately three quarters of all wireless 9-1-1 calls. The funds will be used to partially pay personnel costs of those employees engaged in wireless 9-1-1 call taking and dispatching operations. The city has received between \$1.5 million and \$1.7 million annually since 2014, and anticipates receiving approximately \$1.7 million in 2023.


