Healthy Places Walkability Study Berwyn East/Barnett Recreation Center Neighborhood Mini-Pride

Columbus Public Health Healthy Places program is conducting walkability studies in the 2007 Neighborhood Pride areas. The goals of the walkability study are to increase neighborhood residents walking in their neighborhood and to identify destination places that are within walking distance. This will be done by walking with neighborhood residents to 1) identify positive places to walk in their neighborhood; 2) inventory barriers to pedestrians and bikers; and 3) identify neighborhood destinations.

Overall Comments

- Most side streets are nice to walk on.
- Livingston Ave-people go well over 50 mph and at Barnett there have been accidents.
- Not as safe at night as it is during the day.
- Big issue: the children, there are no sidewalks and they have to get to Scottwood Elementary School (Scottwood between James and Zettler has no sidewalks) for school.
- Pretty neighborhood, people keep up their yard, flowers are in gardens.
- When you get close to James Road, the traffic is faster; need 4-way stops.
- Rosewell Drive-speed bumps in general good.
- The Pinetree Complex has great security. It was the first and currently only property managers to get their Crime Free Certificate. They do good business and have been able to raise rents due to their screening procedures.
- Canini Park used to have lots of gang activity. The sign is vandalized again.
- Gang graffiti has been starting up again at Barnett and the park on Bexvie (Canini Park).
- Safety-personal and traffic is an issue.
 - o People speed
 - o Young people roam
- A new high school is planned for Barnett and Livingston Ave
- There is graffiti at Livingston and Barnett on the COTA stop.
- Neighborhood does not have a grocery store. We have many doctor's offices, bus stops, the library, recreation center and CVS and pharmacies.
- Kids leave the library and don't walk to the light. They cross in the middle of the street to go home.
- Livingston is very busy, often traffic exceeds speed limit! Drivers sometime speed on side streets and Scottwood.
- I feel safe during daylight. I would not walk much at night.
- I usually walk a 4 mile route and usually on side streets.
- Sidewalks are sporadic
- Young drivers drive fast, talk on the phone, loud music.
- The neighborhood is pretty pleasant-lots to see people to talk to
- I feel safe.

This report will be used to create walking maps through the neighborhood. The mile measured maps will highlight neighborhood features, safe paths and destinations. The report will also be forwarded to City of Columbus departments that can assist neighborhoods in addressing their needs.



48	Parking lot at the corner of Barnett Road and Livingston Ave. The Barnett
