Healthy Places Walkability Study Franklinton 2008 Neighborhood Pride

Columbus Public Health Healthy Places program is conducting walkability studies in the 2008 Neighborhood Pride areas. The goals of the walkability study are to increase neighborhood residents walking in their neighborhood and to identify destination places that are within walking distance. This will be done by walking with neighborhood residents to 1) identify positive places to walk in their neighborhood; 2) inventory barriers to pedestrians and cyclists; and 3) identify neighborhood destinations.

Neighborhood Findings

Recreation

- Bike path from Dodge Recreation Center does not connect and stops near the Main Street Bridge construction. There is no signage indicating the bike path does not connect. (pictures 1-17)
- The bike path from Dodge Recreation Center is overgrown and has glass and debris on the path.
- The Dodge Recreation Center is beautiful and has walking paths around the outside as well as a pool and hockey rink.
- There are no bike racks near the pool and if you ride a bike in on MacDowell, parking lot wheel stops prevent you from riding smoothly to the Recreation Center. (pictures 18-21)
- Call boxes on the bike path would make people feel safer-there are homeless on the path as well as graffiti and there are not lights.

**Note: contact was made with Recreation and Parks. There is a long term plan to complete the Dodge Recreation Center bike path to McCoy Park. There is a maintenance schedule for bike paths and lighting on the bike path is rare (due to maintenance issues) although blue phone boxes are now being considered at a certain point on the Olentangy Trail.

Housing

City View has built some new homes in our neighborhood-they are very nice. (pictures 34, 41-42)

Personal Safety

- There is definitely a perception that the neighborhood is not safe. People are afraid of the homeless on the bike path even though we have never heard of homeless people harming anyone. (picture 6)
- I avoid Rich and MacDowell-there are a lot of subsidized apartments in this area.
- Kids in the neighborhood do not have supervision-they run out in front of cars and do not follow pedestrian laws. They are the biggest problem as far as people following the pedestrian laws.
- Most people have their dogs under control; we don't have a big dog problem.

Traffic Safety

Town Street is hard to cross-one way and wide. A traffic light is at Grubb. (picture 25)

Opportunities

- The Boys and Girls Club is at Gift and State Street. (picture 26)
- Pilot Dogs is at Town and Grubb-there is also a traffic light there.
- Franklinton Elementary School at Grubb and State Street.


