

# LEISURE CARDS

The Columbus Recreation and Parks Department uses a photo ID card system, known as “Leisure Cards,” to safely identify participants during admission to our swimming pools and community centers. In order to take advantage of the programs and facilities we offer, you must first obtain a Leisure Card.

## REQUIREMENTS

- Any individual over the age of six must have a Leisure Card.
- Leisure Cards only cost \$1 (new or renewed), and are good for three years from the date of purchase.
- All community centers have the capability to print leisure cards, with the exception of Martin Janis.
- Centers vary in their availability to produce Leisure Cards. Please contact your center for specific hours.

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## CLASS/ACTIVITY REFUND POLICY

**For classes and activities only. See page 11 for Camp Refund Policy.**

- A full refund will be issued for class/activity and online fees if the department cancels the class/activity.
- A refund of the class/activity fee will be issued if a participant cancels before the first meeting/class.
- A 50% refund of the class/activity fee will be issued if a participant cancels after one meeting/class.
- No refunds will be given after the second meeting/class.

# PLAY

PRIVATE LEISURE ASSISTANCE  
FOR YOUTH

**PLAY grants offer financial assistance to families with children who would like to participate in our fee-based programs. When eligibility requirements are met, PLAY can assist families by covering a portion of the program cost.**



PLAY grants can be used to cover the cost of one week of summer camp per eligible participant (up to \$90) or a portion of the fees for one class. Participants are allowed only one PLAY grant per session. **PLAY grants do not apply to CRPD Fitness Camp.**

A completed PLAY application and proof of eligibility should be submitted when registering for camp or class.

## PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

- Copy of current Medicaid, CareSource or Molina insurance card
- Copy of current EPPICard
- Copy of the most recent federal income tax return (scale based upon HUD Section 8 guidelines)

Eligible PLAY applicants will need a coupon code to register for camps online. To receive the code, please submit your PLAY application and proof of eligibility prior to **Friday, January 31.**

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# AQUATICS

Columbus Recreation and Parks Department operates eight outdoor pools throughout the summer. Admission is \$1 per visit unless you have a pool membership. All pool users/visitors are required to have a CRPD Leisure Card or a pool membership.

## DIVE INTO SUMMER

### POOL MEMBERSHIPS

Pool membership includes general admissions to all Columbus Recreation and Parks Department pools - outdoor pools during the summer and the Columbus Aquatics Center during spring, fall and winter - through December 31, 2020. Pool memberships can be purchased at the Aquatics Center and all community centers.

**Memberships are valid for the calendar year of purchase. Anyone entering the pool facility must have a current leisure card or membership on file.**

## REGISTRATION

- Register for classes online or at the pool.
- Each adult can register up to three participants per account.
- **Registration dates are for new participants only.** Participants currently enrolled in a class must wait until the last day of that class to re-register.

# CAMP INFORMATION

To register, visit **ColumbusRecParks.com** and click registration and reservations. If you are a new user, create an account, being sure to include both parent and camper information. Beginning January 20, summer camps can be viewed on the Activenet website.

A confirmation email will be sent immediately after registering online. Prior to registration, there is an option to add desired camps to a Wish List.

Look up your address at [franklincountyauditor.com](http://franklincountyauditor.com). If Columbus is your tax district, you qualify for resident rates.

## RESIDENCY POLICY

A resident is anyone who physically resides within the municipal boundaries of the City of Columbus. Anyone who resides outside the city limits must pay non-resident (NR) fees.

## CANCELLATIONS

Columbus Recreation and Parks Department reserves the right to cancel or adjust camp schedules due to an insufficient number of campers. In the event of cancellation, registrants will be notified by phone. Registrants may transfer to another open camp or receive a full refund. For camper cancellations, see details under our camp refund policy.

## LATE PICK-UP FEES

Campers must be picked up by the end of the specified pick up time. All campers picked up after this time will be assessed a fee that must be paid prior to the camper returning to any camp.

**UP TO 15 MINUTES LATE:** \$10  
**15 MINUTES LATE OR MORE:** \$1 per minute.  
Fees are assessed per camper.

## WAITING LIST

To ensure the best experience for campers, all camps enroll a maximum number of participants.

- If a camp is full, there is an option to be added to the waiting list.
- If successfully enrolled in another program, a camper will not be charged additional fees to be placed on the waiting list for the “full” camp during the same transaction.
- If a camper is added to the “full” camp waiting list only, a \$2 fee will be charged per transaction.
- Campers on the waiting list will be notified by phone if an opening becomes available.

## PLEASE REMEMBER

- Checks, credit cards (VISA, MasterCard or Discover) and cash are accepted.
- All fees must be paid on or before the first day of camp.
- If your check is returned, you will be charged a \$25 fee, payable upon notice to the City of Columbus.
- Campers must be the required age by the first day of camp.
- Unless otherwise noted, camps are held at Community Centers. See map on inside cover for addresses and contact information.



## INCLUSION SUPPORT SERVICES

Columbus Recreation and Parks Department encourages participation from diverse population and accommodates people with varying abilities and learning styles. Inclusion support staff develop accommodation plans to support campers with, but not limited to, developmental and learning disabilities, physical disabilities, sensory challenges, autism, ADHD, Down Syndrome and emotional challenges.

Reasonable accommodations are provided to enable an individual's successful participation in camps. Reasonable accommodations are individualized techniques and resources used to enhance program participation without fundamentally altering the program. Accommodations also help staff create an environment where all campers can have a safe, successful and enjoyable recreation experience. Accommodations are not required to participate in camp programs, however, all campers are required to meet the minimum participation guidelines and desired behavior expectations of the camp. **One-on-one staffing is not provided, however, campers may bring their own support person, who must pass a criminal background check.**

**Availability is limited. Please complete a request immediately after registration is complete.**

- Payment is required for registration. Payment can be made in full or with a \$10 non-refundable deposit for each camp session.
- If a deposit is paid, the credit card on file will be charged the remaining balance one week prior to each registered session of camp. A reservation will not be made until the full payment or deposit has been received.
- Registration forms received in the mail will not be processed until after the February 11 registration date. Some camps will be full after the first day of registration. **Do not send checks, credit card information or money orders with mail-in registration form.**
- Additional information will be emailed. To ensure that the information is received, please provide an updated email address on your Activenet account under the camper's name. *To change a camper's email, choose "Change Information about Family/Friends" under Personal Information.*

## REFUND POLICY

**Please be aware that the \$10 deposit is non-refundable.**

The deposit can be transferred to another Community Recreation Camp if requested by June 1.

All other refund requests must be called in to 614-645-7000 at least 10 business days prior to camp session and followed up with an email (include camper's name, camp name, session number, current address and reason for cancellation) to [wmfrantz@columbus.gov](mailto:wmfrantz@columbus.gov) before the refund can be processed.

- Requests received 6-9 business days prior to camp session will receive a 50% refund.
- Requests received 5 business days or less prior to camp session will not receive a refund.
- Refunds take 6-8 weeks to process.
- A \$15 processing fee will be assessed for each refund request.





# PICKLEBALL

Pickleball is a combination of tennis, badminton and table tennis, with players using a paddle to hit a whiffle-like ball over a net. Competitors play in singles, doubles or mixed doubles, and like most net games, a powerful serve is always an asset. Pickleball is one of the fastest-growing sports in the country and has gained popularity among fans of all ages and abilities who enjoy friendly competition and healthy lifestyles.

In 2019, Columbus Recreation and Parks added 23 more court overlays throughout the city and increased instructional and open court times at our community recreation centers, with plans to add additional dedicated courts in the future.

We offer 118 Pickleball courts at 35 locations - 60 for indoor play and 58 for play outdoors - including three dedicated Pickleball courts at Marion Franklin Park. ## **ENSURE YOUR ANIMALS STAY SAFE**

Direct Control is part of Columbus City Code 2327.11 (Animals Running at Large) and means that an animal is on a leash/tether or will come, sit, and stay on command from the owner.

Under this code:

- No owner of any animal shall permit such animal to run large (off leash) on any property not his own.
- The pet must respond immediately to the owner's command to be under direct control.
- The pet is considered not to be under direct control if it chases, injures, or kills any person, domestic animal, or damages or commits any nuisance upon property other than that of its owner.

Whoever violates Columbus Code 2327.11 is guilty of permitting animals to run at large, a minor misdemeanor. If the animal is a dog, a violation of this section is a third-degree misdemeanor.

If the animal causes physical harm to any person, or if the offender is, or has been, the owner of a dog which was declared a dangerous or vicious animal, a violation of this section is a first-degree misdemeanor.

Columbus Recreation and Parks Department is committed to the safety and well-being of the people and the pets in our community. We invite all pet lovers to work with us to keep our community welcoming and safe for everyone.

# CITY LEADERS

This nine-month initiative works to develop Columbus' leaders of tomorrow by providing, hands-on education and mentoring. City Leaders offers an immersive learning experience for participants, teaching them about the inner workings of the City of Columbus. Areas of focus include Science, Technology, Arts, History, Education, Health and Nutrition, Social Services, Law Enforcement, Safety, Government, Economic Development and Community Service. In addition to experiential learning opportunities, participants benefit from mentoring by current leaders from within the City of Columbus and local partner organizations.

This leadership opportunity is open to middle schoolers, grades 6-8 and ages 10-15, who reside within the City of Columbus. The hope is that the selection process will render a very diverse group of forward-thinking children, eager to learn all about their city and become a catalyst for change. # APPLICATIONS FOR PURPOSE, PRIDE AND SUCCESS (APPS)

Our APPS program is designed to help reduce neighborhood crime and violence, through the use of proven prevention and intervention strategies which increase protective factors in the lives of Columbus youth and young adults, ages 14-23.

## CAP CITY NIGHTS FESTIVALS

Each summer, we host neighborhood celebrations that serve as both community-building and prevention activities, while creating positive, healthy and safe community relationships. We are intentional in bringing together neighborhood residents, area leaders, service providers, business owners, civic groups and the faith community. Festivals include music, food and beverages, games and activities, community resource information, and lots of fun for the entire family.

## JOB READINESS PROGRAM

Our nine-week, life skills and professional development program provides training, mentorship and job placement at worksites throughout the city. We offer an Education Individual Development Account (IDA) for participants who complete certification in EverFi Financial Literacy, which rewards those who save their earnings with an \$8 to \$1 match, to be used for post-secondary educational expenses. The maximum amount that can be matched is \$500, giving them \$4,500 to put toward expenses for trade school and/or 2-year or 4-year accredited colleges and universities. Experienced job coaches perform daily worksite visits to provide support and guidance.

## NEIGHBORHOOD VIOLENCE INTERVENTION

Our Neighborhood Violence Intervention (NVI) program uses proven strategies to interrupt violence at the street level and promote conflict resolution. Trained Interventionists use mediation, conflict resolution and community crisis response tactics as part of our proactive strategy to stop violence before it happens.

# GO LUNCH!



Just because school's out, doesn't mean lunch has to be. Join us for free, nutritious meals all summer long. Go, Lunch!, which is Columbus Recreation and Parks Department's Summer Food Program, provides fun, safe spaces to meet new friends, learn and play, and enjoy healthy food and snacks while kids and teens are out of school. Go, Lunch! takes place at our community centers and at partner locations. (Dates and times may vary.)

Each summer, Go, Lunch! serves more than 500,000 meals at more than 175 locations in the Columbus area. These meals are served to anyone between the ages of 1-18. Meals are also available for anyone ages 18-21 who has been determined by a State or Local Education Agency (LEA) to be mentally or physically disabled and involved in an Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Columbus Recreation and Parks Department offers a variety of opportunities for employment in Parks, Recreation, Sports, Permits, Communications, Golf, Planning and Design, Special Events, Human Resources and Fiscal. These opportunities are full and part-time and some can even start out as seasonal jobs for youth.

#### **RECREATION SECTION**

**Recreation and Park Aide** – Assists staff within the community center with various tasks; such as ensuring standards of acceptable conduct, cleaning and maintaining the facilities, opening and closing buildings and assisting with activities within the center.

**Lifeguard** – Monitors the swimming pool in order to direct water safety and prevent accidents, teaches swimming lessons and maintains pool/pool deck.

#### **PARKS, GOLF & SPORTS SECTION**

**Recreation and Park Aide** – Performs general grounds cleaning work such as: picking up debris, raking leaves, pulling weeds, trimming bushes, mowing grass, digging holes for planting, emptying trash barrels, and cleaning and maintaining restrooms.

#### **PERMITS SECTION**

**Recreation and Park Aide** – Acts as an attendant at a variety of department-operated rental facilities, by collecting and verifying user permits, ensuring standards of acceptable conduct, and cleaning and maintaining the facilities; opens and closes rental facilities at designated times.
