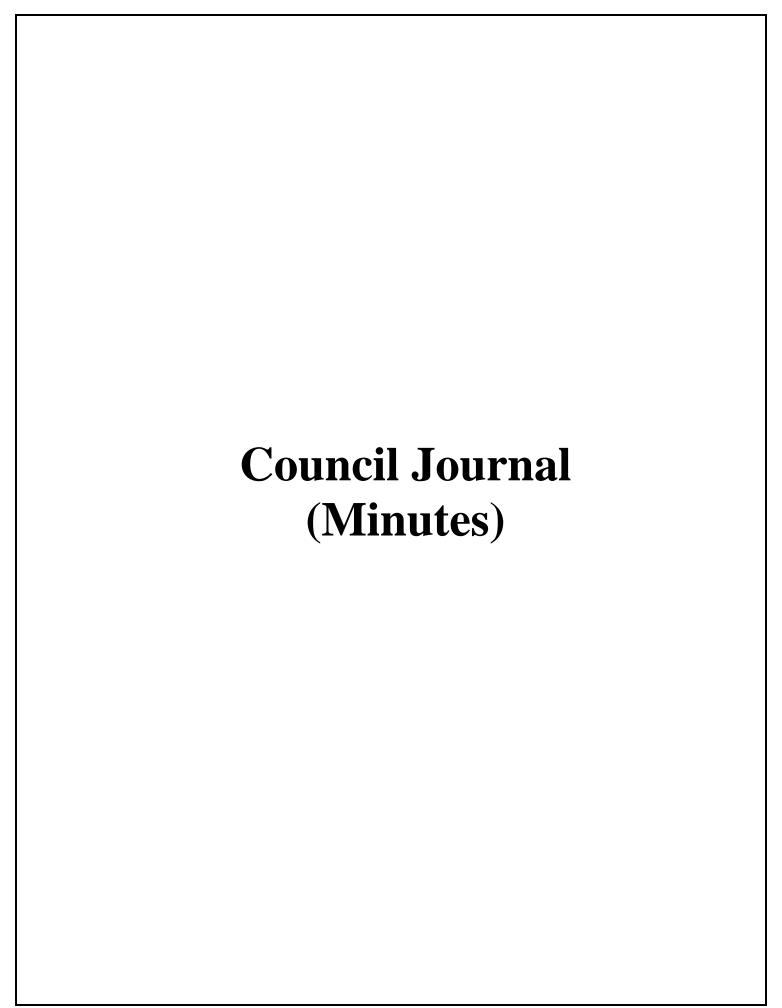


SIGNING OF LEGISLATION

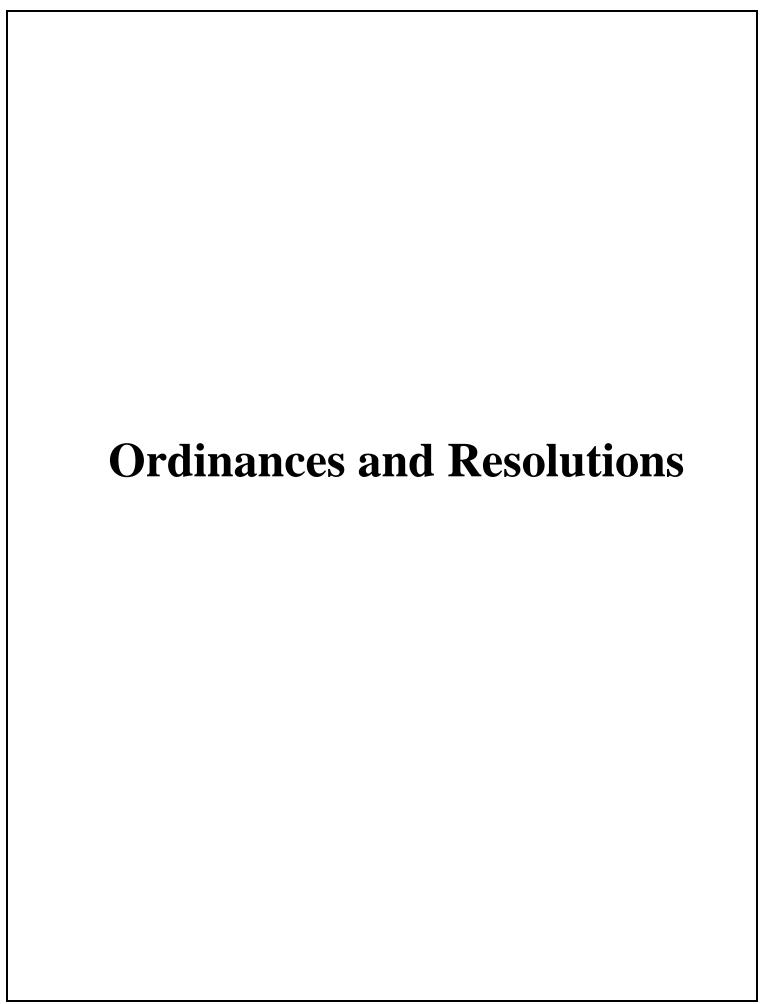

This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Utilities to enter into a contract with Duke's Root Control, Inc. for a program to kill root growth in sanitary sewer lines 6" to 36" in diameter and inhibit root re-growth. The Division of Sewerage and Drainage (DOSD) wishes to enter into a contract to and including December 31, 2024.

DOSD determined that the chemical diquat dibromide is the most effective way to treat roots in sewers. Diquat dibromide, classified as non-carcinogenic and not considered a volatile compound, is approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for this use. Additionally, diquat dibromide has little or no effect on treatment plant processes, making this chemical preferred for use in the root control program. The Division has further determined that other chemicals are not acceptable for use in this program due to either ineffectiveness or the presence of metam sodium, which the US EPA classifies as a probable carcinogen.

Duke's Root Control, Inc. is the only commercial applicator licensed to apply diquat dibromide, which the company does through its proprietary product known as Razorooter. Duke's Root Control, Inc. is registered with the Ohio Department of Agriculture and its applicators are certified by the agency to perform pesticide applications to sewers.

While there are multiple ways to treat root growth and inhibit re-growth, the effectiveness of Razorooter and its classification as non-carcinogenic and not a volatile compound mean it is in the best interest of the City to waive the provisions of competitive bidding and enter into a contract with Duke's Root Control, Inc. for these services.

BACKGROUND: Columbus Public Health has been awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. This ordinance is needed to accept and appropriate \$3,373,795.00 in grant monies to fund the Ryan White Part A HIV Care grant program, for the period March 1, 2025 through February 28, 2026. The total amount funded for this period is \$3,373,795.00

The Ryan White Part A (RWPA) HIV Care grant's purpose is to improve access to medical care for persons living with HIV or AIDS living in Central Ohio. The goal is that each client will achieve viral suppression, which improves their quality of life and reduces the risk of spreading the infection. This grant will enhance medical services for both somatic and behavioral health, pay for HIV related doctor's visits, mental health services, substance abuse services, and other services allowable by the grant, and strengthen the case management and linkage to care programs at CPH.

In 2023, the RWPA program for the Central Ohio area served 2,492 people living with HIV through programs

including outpatient/ambulatory medical care, mental health services, medical case management, early intervention services, housing services, non-medical case management, emergency financial assistance and medical transportation.

HRSA has tasked CPH to improve the efficiency of the reallocation of funds as necessary in order to minimize unused funds to the greatest extent possible and to maximize the available services and avoid potential penalties as future carryover funds may not be permitted by HRSA. BACKGROUND: The Director of the Department of Development is requesting authorization to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement on behalf of the City with Central Columbus Commerce 71 Development, LLC (BLDG 1) (and also the "Enterprise"). The Ohio Enterprise Zone law Section 5709.62(C) of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the City to enter into a Council-approved tax abatement agreements between the City and qualifying companies.

Central Columbus Commerce 71 Development, LLC (BLDG 1) was established in 2024 and is a limited liability company 100% owned by Hillwood, a Perot Company. Built on the legacy of the Perot family, Hillwood is a culmination of business success that began in 1988. Hillwood is now an international development company that specializes in developing Class A industrial facilities on a build-to-suit and proactive basis. Hillwood has successfully developed over 260 million square feet of industrial space to date. The company operates internationally with its corporate offices located in Dallas, Texas.

Central Columbus Commerce 71 Development, LLC (BLDG 1) is proposing to invest a total project cost of approximately \$22,500,000.00 in real property improvements to construct new operations. The new construction

will consist of an approximately 288,000 square-foot proactive Class A industrial facility. The proposed new facility will be constructed on approximately 37 +/- acres of undeveloped land located at 1285 Joyce Ave. Columbus, Ohio 43219 (the "**Project Site**"), parcel number 010-126232. Additionally, Central Columbus Commerce 71 Development, LLC (BLDG 1) proposes to create twenty-nine (29) net new full-time permanent positions with an estimated annual payroll of approximately \$1,206,400.00 at the proposed **Project Site** ("New Employees").

Email is the most common vector threat actors use to attack City employees and computer systems while attempting to steal passwords and sensitive information, commit fraud, destroy city data or encrypt city files to hold as ransom. Proofpoint is used as the primary protection against email attacks.

Ordinance 1986-2022 authorized the Director of the Department of Technology to enter into contract with CDW Government, LLC for the Proofpoint software and support. Through RFQ010244, DoT solicited quotations and awarded the contract to the lowest responsive bidder. The initial contract commenced on December 23, 2022 and ended on December 22, 2023. This contract allowed for two (2) additional one-year terms, subject to mutual agreement and the approval of proper City authorities.

Ordinance 2740-2023 authorized the first renewal of the subject contract. This ordinance is the second, and last, renewal of this contract. The term of this second renewal will be for one year, starting on December 23, 2024 and ending on December 22, 2025, at a cost of \$458,645.86.

Funds for this contract are budgeted and available in the Information Services operating fund.

Background: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Recreation and Parks Department to enter into contract with Pavement Protectors DBA M&D Blacktop Company for the Hard Surface Program 2024 - Phase 2 Project. The contract amount is \$1,062,661.25, with alternates of \$210,000.00 and a contingency of \$120,000.00, for a total of \$1,392,661.25 being authorized by this ordinance.

Recreation and Parks allocates a portion of the Capital Improvement Budget (CIB) to improve existing hard surfaces and accessibility every year. This project will construct sites designed as part of the annual hard surface improvements design package. The program focuses on the removal and replacement of existing asphalt and concrete surfaces that are highly used by the public, including parking lots, park drives, sport courts, and walkways. These improvements ensure safe and easy access to parks and facilities. Areas for improvement are determined by requests from internal staff and the public. All requests are then assessed and given a Pavement Condition Rating (PCR), indicating a rank from 0, meaning worst condition, to 100, meaning best condition. Requests are then prioritized for action based on their respective PCR scores and feedback from relevant stakeholders. The anticipated project schedule will begin in the fall of 2024 and finish in the summer of 2025.

The City of Columbus, Department of Public Utilities offers a Low-Income Water and Sewer Discount Program to qualifying customers. A 20% discount is available on water and sewer consumption charges for qualifying low-income customers. A similar program is in development for low-income Power customers. In 2023 and 2024, the department offered a one-time \$60 and \$65 bill credit, respectively, for approved Water low-income customers to offset the annual rate increases for those years. These credits were made possible due to the City's receipt of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, which were appropriated to the City's Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. Enough ARPA balance remains that the City intends to issue one-time bill credits for approved Water low-income customers in 2025 and 2026. The City would also like to offer one-time bill credits to Division of Power low-income customers contingent on future rates increases and low-income discount program development.

The purpose of this legislation is to encumber funds from the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to be transferred to fund bill credits in 2025 and 2026.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is sufficient budget authority available in the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund's Budget to fund the encumbrance, which totals \$707,711.00.

1. BACKGROUND

The United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for approximately \$1.3 billion in discretionary grant funding for FY 2024 through the Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant program. This is the third round of funding for the SS4A grant program. The amended NOFO was released on April 16, 2024 and remained open through August 29, 2024.

The purpose of SS4A grants is to improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through safety action plan development and implementation focused on all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, public transportation users, motorists, personal conveyance and micromobility users, and commercial vehicle operators. The program provides funding to develop the tools to help strengthen a community's approach to roadway safety and save lives and is designed to meet the needs of diverse local, Tribal, and regional communities that differ dramatically in size, location, and experience administering Federal funding. There are two types of funding: Planning (including supplemental planning) and Demonstration Grants; and Implementation Grants. The City meets the criteria to be eligible to request either type of funding.

When Columbus worked with community partners to launch Vision Zero Columbus in 2020, it made a commitment to protecting lives above all else on the city's transportation system. The proposed Vulnerable Road User project helps carry this commitment forward. Vision Zero Columbus crash data have already confirmed that Columbus' Vulnerable Road Users and Communities of Interest have suffered a disproportionate share of the traffic violence in Columbus. The Vulnerable Road User project will provide the data analysis and plan updates necessary to ensure Columbus is able to equitably, comprehensively prioritize the most vulnerable road users and communities in executing the 2023-2028 Vision Zero Action Plan and other transportation plans. In particular, the funding would support the following:

- Development of a Comprehensive Vulnerable Road User Safety Plan that will include development of a pedestrian priority network (that does not currently exist for City of Columbus), an implementation toolbox, and a new 5-year Safe Routes to School District Wide School Travel Plan..
- Development of a Lighting for Safety Prioritization Plan in collaboration with Division of Power at Department of Public Utilities. This would update their existing policy to better define safety in alignment with Vision Zero Columbus as they prioritize the installation of new lighting.

The Department estimates the total cost of the supplemental planning programs to be approximately \$1.65 million. It anticipates requesting approximately \$1.32 million in SS4A funding USDOT, and it anticipates this SS4A award will provide approximately 80% of the proposed supplemental planning activities.

This legislation will authorize the Director of Public Service to apply for a SS4A Program Grant, execute agreements with USDOT or others in connection with the award of the grant, expend awarded grant funds, and the return of unused grant funds if any should remain at the end of the grant.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

No financial participation is required at this time. City funds will be approved and appropriated in the form of design contracts and/or construction contracts that will be or have been submitted for Council's approval.

1. BACKGROUND

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) began accepting applications for its Municipal Bridge Program on July 1, 2024, and applications were due August 15, 2024. The Municipal Bridge Program provides federal funds to municipal corporations, metroparks and Regional Transit Authorities for bridge replacement or bridge rehabilitation projects. ODOT will cover up to 80% of eligible costs for preliminary engineering and construction, and it also has limited availability of 15% Toll Revenue Credit (TRC) for construction phase only as long as TRC is available. Total awards are capped at \$2.5 million. In order to receive funding, a bridge must either be on ODOT's Target Bridge List or be eligible due to inspection results received after the list was

generated.

The City meets the criteria to be eligible to submit an application to rehabilitate the Ohio Center Way bridge (Bridge Structure File Number 2563126) over CSX's and Norfolk Southern's railroad tracks at the convention center. The project would also replace the bridge's existing asphalt overlay with a new concrete overlay, and other repairs as needed. The Department estimates the total project cost will be approximately \$1,039,300.00, and it is requesting \$797,335.00 from ODOT's Municipal Bridge Program.

This legislation will authorize the Director of Public Service to execute agreements with ODOT in connection with the award of the grant, the expenditure of grant funds, and the return of unused grant funds if any should remain at the end of the grant.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

No financial participation is required at this time. City funds will be approved and appropriated in the form of design contracts and/or construction contracts that will be or have been submitted for Council's approval.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to apply for a Municipal Bridge Program Grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation; to authorize the execution of grant and other requisite agreements with ODOT and other entities providing for the acceptance and administration of said grant award on behalf of the City of Columbus, Department of Public Service; to authorize the expenditure of any awarded funds and the refund of any unused funds. (\$0.00)

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) announced funding for its Municipal Bridge Program, which is a grant program to be awarded on a competitive basis; and

This ordinance authorizes the Director of Finance and Management to enter into contract with Best Equipment Co., Inc. for the purchase of three (3) Labrie Automizer HD Right Hand ASL garbage trucks, on behalf of the Department of Public Service, Division of Refuse Collection. This purchase will assist the Division with adding to the city-owned fleet of operable garbage trucks and preserving the current schedule for refuse collection throughout the City. The vendor is also offering a substantial discount of the garbage trucks, which will help to preserve budgeted funds.

The Division of Refuse Collection provides waste pick-up and disposal service throughout the City of Columbus. Due to long lead times associated with the production and delivery of new vehicles, and needed repairs and/or the replacement of current vehicles, this critical operation does not have enough functional vehicles to fulfill daily operations. Therefore, the purchase of a readily available vehicle appropriate for this type of operation is necessary to avoid the interruption of City scheduled refuse collection services.

Best Equipment Co., Inc. is offering to allow the City to purchase these trucks at a discounted rate. Due to the urgent need and very long production delays for new trucks, the Department of Public Service feels it is in the best interest of the City of Columbus to purchase these ready-to-use vehicles.

Searches in the System for Award Management (Federal) and the Findings for Recovery list (State) produced no findings against Best Equipment Co., Inc.

BACKGROUND: This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a service contract with Econsult Solutions, Inc. to provide a market analysis for the Livingston Avenue area and authorize payments for services starting October 1, 2024, until August 31, 2025.

The City of Columbus seeks balanced, equitable neighborhoods where residents all have access to financial stability and economic opportunity. Through activities by the Department of Development and other city agencies partnering with the City, the City is committed to supporting and encouraging scalable economic development throughout Columbus. The Economic Development Division carries out this role by supporting, collaborating, and partnering as necessary in development and revitalization efforts.

This study intends to examine the market for small business growth in the Livingston Avenue area. The focus will be on retail and small commercial businesses that can re-invigorate and invest in the traditional neighborhood business corridors of East Livingston Avenue and Alum Creek Drive in the Driving Park area.

The Department of Development advertised RFQ026836 through the Vendor Services portal on February 14, 2024, and accepted proposals for Livingston Avenue Area Market Analysis through the Bonfire portal on March 19, 2024. Five (5) proposals were submitted in response to RFQ026836 in accordance with the relevant provisions of Chapter 329 of the Columbus City Codes. An evaluation committee of members from the Driving Park Civic Association, Old Oaks Civic Association, Rickenbacker Woods Foundation, and the Department of Neighborhoods and City Council selected Econsult Solutions, Inc. The evaluation was based on prior experience, project competence, and other factors.

Contract Compliance: The vendor number is 048471 and expires 3/15/2026.

Fiscal Impact: This ordinance authorizes an expenditure of \$149,820.00 within the Economic Development Division's General Fund budget.

To authorize the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a contract with Econsult Solutions, Inc., in an amount up to \$149,820.00 to provide a market analysis for the Livingston Avenue area; to authorize

the expenditure of \$149,820.00 from the Economic Development Division's General Fund budget; and to authorize reimbursement of expenses incurred prior to execution of the purchase order. (\$149,820.00)

The Division of Traffic Management is the sole user for pavement marking material. Thermoplastic marking materials are used to paint yellow and white roadway striping. This modification is necessary to ensure that we do not have a lapse in the contract, which would affect traffic safety throughout the City of Columbus. The contract, PO254409 was established in accordance with Request for Quotation RFQ016449 and will expire December 31, 2024.

No additional funds are necessary to modify the option contract as requested. There is no change in the type of products or services being procured. The original contract was formally bid(RFQ016449). The original terms and conditions will remain in effect. The City of Columbus and Ennis Flint Inc had previously agreed on the option to extend the contract for two (2) one -year periods. The original ordinance number 2363-2020 states the proposed contract has the option to renew for one (1) additional year.

Columbus City Council passed Ordinance 2647-2022 to enter into a grant agreement with the YWCA of Columbus, in an amount up to \$30,000.00 to sponsor the Undesign the Redline exhibition. This ordinance was then amended by Ordinance 0529-2023 to establish that costs from October 17, 2022 until the creation of the purchase order be eligible for reimbursement. The grant agreement could not be executed before the Undesign the Redline exhibits were facilitated.

Undesign the Redline is a traveling educational exhibit that explores the history of structural racism and inequality, and how community development policies such as redlining, slum clearance, highway construction and others designed structural racism into American cities. The immersive exhibit creates a platform for Columbus residents to learn the history of these policies, interact with the stories of individuals and neighborhoods impacted, and invent the future of undoing structural inequities.

At the time of producing Ordinance 2467-2022 and 0529-2023, there was a miscommunication on the sponsorship amount that was requested. Through its sponsorship of the exhibit, the City of Columbus not only provided sponsorship for the facilitation of the Undesign the Redline exhibit at six locations in Columbus between October and December of 2022, but also the Columbus launch of the exhibit at the YWCA's Activists and Agitators program. Therefore, the sponsorship of the YWCA's Activists and Agitators program results in an additional request of up to \$30,000.00 to sponsor the YWCA's Activists and Agitators program exhibit.

Emergency action is requested in order to immediately provide up to \$30,000.00 for costs already incurred to sponsor the YWCA's Activists and Agitators program exhibit.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for this agreement is included in the Department of Development's 2024 General Fund Budget.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: The Young Women's Christian Association's vendor number is 006086 and expires 1/9/2026.

Ordinance 2629-2021 authorized the Director of the Department of Development to waive Columbus City Code Chapter 329 and enter into a contract with Benevate, Inc. for the software. After three years of use, the Housing Division would like to continue using the software, to enable safe and secure intake of applications, facilitate work from any location, and provide prompts to applicants to assure that a complete application is submitted.

In October 2021, Columbus City Council approved ordinance 2629-2021 to enter into a contract with Benevate, Inc and waived competitive bidding.

In December 2022, Columbus City Council approved ordinance 3413-2022 to enter into a contract with Benevate, Inc and waived competitive bidding.

In November 9, 2023, Columbus City Council approved ordinance 2974-2023 to enter into a contract with Benevate, Inc and waived competitive bidding. The current contract expires on December 14, 2024.

In June 27, 2024, Columbus City Council approved ordinance 1687-2024 to modify the existing contract with Benevate, Inc to provide 16 additional licenses and Database Lookup functionality, and waived competitive bidding. The current contract expires on December 14, 2024.

Contract Compliance: The vendor number is 039660 and expires 10/16/2025.

Waiver Request: A waiver of the competitive procurement requirements outlined in Columbus City Code Chapter 329.18 is being requested, as Neighborly is the only hosted software currently available for purchase that can address all of the City of Columbus, Department of Development, and Housing Division's needs in one solution.

BACKGROUND:

On October 3, 2012 the Columbus City Treasurer's Office issued a request for proposal, for various banking services among which was merchant processing services.

Huntington Merchant Services was awarded the contract for merchant processing. On May 6, 2013, Columbus City Council authorized contracts and expenditures for the first year of banking services, for the period of June 1, 2013 through May 31, 2014. On February 14, 2022 ordinance number 0374-2022 was passed by Columbus City Council which authorized the tenth year of a ten year renewal of banking services with Huntington Merchant Services for the period from June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023.

The City Treasurer's Office in collaboration with the City Auditor's Office and the Department of Finance and Management developed a banking RFP with an expansion of the services beyond traditional banking.

Gateway services, which facilitate the City's on-line payments are currently under contract until March 1, 2026, subject to annual appropriation and approval by Columbus City Council. The award of merchant processing services included gateway services and, as a consequence, more time for the transition to the new banking partner is needed. Huntington Merchant Services agreed to extend the current terms and conditions of the contract awarded in 2013 for the period of the modification of a year from May 31, 2023 to May 31, 2024 with a one-year option to renew the term.

City Council authorized the City Treasurer's Office to exercise its option to renew the contract for one year through May 31, 2025 with passage of ordinance 0484-2024 on February 26, 2024.

The City Treasurer now wishes to add the necessary funding on behalf of the many City agencies that offer credit cards as a method of payment to their customers.

Emergency designation is requested to provide funding as soon as possible so that the public's use of credit cards is uninterrupted.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding for this ordinance is budgeted and available within the various funds' 2024 appropriations.

Ordinance 1931-2023, approved by City Council on July 30, 2023 provided the Mayor's Office of Education the authority to contract with certain early learning providers as part of the 2023-2024 Early Start Columbus school year program.

To continue this important work over the summer months, the Office of Education drafted Ordinance 0975-2024, erroneously providing the Office the authority to enter into new contracts with existing providers. The Office should have requested the authority to modify the original contracts established under Ordinance 1931-2023 - not establish new contracts.

Therefore, the Office of Education requests the authority to amend Ordinance 0975-2024 and modify the existing contracts established under Ordinance 1931-2024.

The considerations for the contract modifications include: the additional amount included for the contract modifications are \$974,000.00, which funding was appropriated and encumbered under Ord 0975-2024; the need for additional programing was known at the time when the contracts were initially awarded, however the funding to provide the services was provided at a later date; it would not be in the city's best interests to have the additional contract requirements awarded through other procurement processes because the existing providers are already performing the contracted services serving children; the price for the continued programming is consistent with the funding provided in the original contracts.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no new funding associated with this ordinance.

This legislation authorizes the City of Columbus to accept and appropriate a \$20,106.56 U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance, Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant subaward from Franklin County Board of Commissioners' Office of Justice Policy and Programs (2022-JAG-2000). Award dollars fund a portion of total compensation for the Columbus City Attorney's Blueprint for Safety Director to continue leadership of the county-wide Blueprint for Safety Interagency Domestic Response initiative through December 31th, 2024. This position was previously supported with a federal U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Justice Programs, Office on Violence Against Women grant, and the city and county see value in continued investment in this role. This grant, plus an investment from the City Attorney's general fund, will fund this position through the end of 2024, and will be fully funded through contributions from the county and the city in 2025.

According to the Ohio Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System survey, 1 in 5 Ohio households have experienced intimate partner violence and these impacted households also report significantly higher rates of poor physical health, stroke, asthma, depression, binge drinking and unlocked firearms in the home. This emphasizes that households experiencing violence not only deal with the immediate impact of physical injuries and the emotional turmoil resulting from the ongoing controlling behavior of their abusers but are more also more likely to struggle with poor physical, mental and behavioral health across their lifetimes--chronic conditions that impact their ability to work, engage with support systems and thrive in their daily lives. Domestic violence impacts victims, household members, colleagues, employers and schools. Domestic violence touches everyone.

The Blueprint for Safety initiative is organized with a multi-disciplinary team at its foundation working together to deploy a coordinated response to domestic violence crimes. This team has done system mapping, policy reviews and focus groups to inform process improvements, communication & data sharing practices and training for justice professionals and victim service providers. These collaborative actions allowed them to streamline justice services, close system gaps and create seamless linkages between justice and provider systems allowing professionals to work in concert to keep victims safe and hold offenders accountable. Blueprint efforts support the needs of victims and justice professionals with the end goal of improved individual and public safety.

BACKGROUND:

Columbus Public Health received additional grant carryover funds from fiscal year 2023, for the Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) grant program, referenced in Ordinance No. 0441-2024. This ordinance authorizes the Board of Health to modify an existing contract with Knupp, Watson & Wallman, Inc. for services that include HIV and other STI screening, PrEP education and referral, linkage to care for persons with HIV and/or an STI, and retention in HIV care. The term of the contract is June 1, 2024, through February 28, 2025, with funding based on service assessments for allowable services under the Ending the HIV Epidemic Grant program.

This contract was originally set at a price point of \$119,599.00, was modified by \$280,401.00 via ordinance 2457-2024 using fiscal year 2021 and fiscal year 2022 carryover funds, and is being increased by \$200,000.00 via fiscal year 2023 carryover funds for a new total amount of \$600,000.00 via Ordinance 2678-2024. This contract is being modified due to Columbus Public Health needing additional prevention services via media platforms to meet program needs. These services are outlined in an approved carryover budget. Furthermore, services are further expanded with Knupp, Watson & Wallman, Inc. to serve more EHE recipients and meet program deliverables with carryover funds from fiscal year 2023. This modification will allow the additional provision of outreach to build awareness and provide education regarding the importance of medical care and viral suppression, screening for persons at risk of HIV and making referrals for PrEP. Knupp, Watson & Wallman, Inc. These services were competitively bid through vendor services (RFQ22658) and Bonfire (Sexual Health Outreach Campaign) in August of 2022, according to bidding requirements of the City Code. All price points included in this modification were established per service being delivered and reviewed in an approved budget.

The Roadway - LinkUS - W Broad Corridor BRT project, which is being administered by COTA, is a 9.3-mile mobility infrastructure project to improve transit service along the Broad Street corridor, consisting of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and up to seventeen (17) enhanced BRT stations between Rockbrook Crossing Avenue/Doherty Road and Washington Avenue, including segments off Broad Street along Cleveland Avenue, Long Street, and Washington Avenue. This effort is aligned with other City-led projects in the area.

The Department of Public Service and COTA mutually agree it is necessary for the parties to execute several agreements relative to the project outlining the obligations and responsibilities each will assume during the final

design, right-of-way acquisition, construction, and post-construction phases of the aforementioned project. This legislation seeks to authorize to execution of the following agreements between the Department of Public Service and COTA: 1) a Memorandum of Agreement or a similar instrument, and any amendments or modifications thereto as may be necessary; 2) an infrastructure maintenance agreement to facilitate the upkeep of general improvements constructed or installed within the public right-of-way as part of the Roadway - LinkUS - W Broad Corridor BRT project; and 3) maintenance and operations agreements specifically concerning the Columbus Traffic Signal System (CTSS), the Transit Signal Priority (TSP) System, and the fiber optic components needed to support expansion of said systems. It also may be necessary for the Department of Public Service to waive certain permit application fees to facilitate the construction and maintenance of the planned public infrastructure improvements.

2. FISCAL IMPACT

The encumbrance and expenditure of any capital or operating funds the Department of Public Service may need to fulfill the obligations and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to the agreements contemplated herein will be legislated separately.

Ordinance 3278-2022 authorized CourtView Justice Solutions, Inc., d/b/a Equivant ("CourtView Justice Solution, Inc.") to implement the FedEx Portal and provide software upgrades necessary for the daily operations and the receipt of real time updates from FedEx Corporation ("FedEx") for the Franklin County Municipal Court Clerk ("Municipal Court Clerk").

Ordinance 2248-2023 authorized the City Auditor to transfer \$200,000.00 and enter into a contract for the provision of commercial carrier service and allow the Municipal Court Clerk to enter into the program established by the Ohio Association of Municipal/County Court Clerks which allows courts to have exclusive pricing and service to aid in the delivery of court documents unmatched by the state term contract. Village Venture, LLC operates under the guidance of Alina Sharafutdinova and consists of a team of data scientists, a data QA admin, and a project manager. For over five years of RREACT's operations, Alina Sharafutdinova has provided program management contract services to the RREACT team.

COLUMBUS SOUTH SIDE AREA COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

WHEREAS, by application #CV24-095, the owner of property at **160 E. BARTHMAN AVE. (43207)**, is requesting a Council variance to allow a four-unit dwelling with reduced development standards in the R-3, Residential District; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.035, R-3, residential district, lists single-unit dwellings as the only allowable residential use, while the applicant proposes to repurpose the existing building into a four-unit dwelling; and

WHEREAS, Section 3321.07(B), Landscaping, requires one tree per ten residential units, a requirement of one tree for a four-unit dwelling, while the applicant proposes none; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.05(A)(4), Area district lot width requirements, requires a minimum lot width of 50 feet in the R-3, Residential District, while the applicant proposes to maintain a lot width of $43.5\pm$ feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.13, R-3 area district requirements, requires that a single-unit dwelling or other principal building be situated on a lot with an area that equals or exceeds 5,000 square feet, while the applicant proposes a four-unit dwelling on an existing lot containing 1,392 square feet; and

WHEREAS, Section 3332.18(D), Basis of computing area, requires that a building shall occupy alone or together with any other building no greater than 50 percent of the lot area, while the applicant proposes to maintain an increased lot coverage of 87 percent; and

BACKGROUND: The Finance and Management Department, Office of Construction Management, employs personnel that are engaged in overseeing various construction and building renovation capital projects for the City. The staffing costs for the Office of Construction Management are initially expensed to the general fund; however, the portion related to managing capital projects is eligible to be capitalized. Doing so is consistent with earlier efforts by the Office of Construction Management to reimburse the general fund when the general fund has incurred expenses more appropriate to capital improvement funding. The Office of Construction Management tracks the hours each employee works on individual projects and bills these hours to the associated capital project. This process reimburses the general fund for the portion of staff time attributable to capital projects.

Emergency action is requested so that reimbursement to the general fund can occur as quickly as possible. Up-to-date financial posting promotes accurate accounting and financial management.

Fiscal Impact: This ordinance authorizes the City Auditor to encumber \$135,422.82 within the Construction Management Capital Improvement Fund and \$5,563.18 within the Neighborhood Health Center Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of Office of Construction Management staffing costs.

To amend the 2024 Capital Improvement Budget; to authorize a transfer within the Construction Management Capital Improvement Fund; to authorize the expenditure of \$135,422.82 from the Construction Management Capital Improvement Fund; and to authorize the expenditure of \$5,563.18 from the Neighborhood Health Center Capital Reserve Fund in order to reimburse the general fund for construction and building renovation expenses incurred by the Office of Construction Management; and to declare an emergency. Background: Ordinance No. 1699-2020 rezoned the property at the northwest corner of the intersection of West Broad Street and Doherty Road located at 5930 West Broad Street (Tax ID Parcel No. 570-184818, the "Private Improvements Site"); it also required certain public infrastructure improvements to Doherty Road and West Broad Street (the "Project"). Metro Development LLC (the "Developer") invested approximately \$18 million at the Private Improvement Site to develop 192 multi-family units and other improvements (the "Private Improvements"). As the Private Improvements Site is subject to the *Big Darby Accord Watershed Master Plan* (2006) and the revenue program created by Resolution No. 0216X-2008, City Council, by its Ordinance No. 2535-2020, authorized the City and Developer to enter the Big Darby - Crown Pointe Development Agreement dated December 1, 2020 to outline the establishment of tax increment financing, a new community authority, and a developer contribution. The City and the Developer anticipated financing the Project with obligations that would be repaid from the aforementioned public revenues generated by the Private Improvements.

City Council created a tax increment financing area over the Private Improvement Site pursuant to R.C. Section 5709.40(B) (the "West Broad Street TIF") by its passage of Ordinance No. 2990-2021, as subsequently amended by Ordinance No. 3154-2022 to add additional parcels. Furthermore, City Council created a new community authority (NCA) over the Private Improvement Site (the "Big Darby West Broad Street NCA") pursuant to R.C. Chapter 349 by its adoption of Resolution Nos. 0060X-2021 and 0242-2021, and has since expanded the district of the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA by additionally adopted resolutions. This legislation approves and authorizes the Director of the Department of Development to enter into a cooperative agreement (the "Cooperative Agreement") by and among the City, the Big Darby West Broad Street NCA, the Developer, and the Columbus-Franklin County Finance Authority (the "Issuer") pursuant to which the Issuer will issue bonds to finance a portion of the Project. This legislation will also authorize the appropriation and transfer or expenditure of the service payments in lieu of taxes generated from the Private Improvement within the West Broad Street TIF pursuant to the Cooperative Agreement.

Emergency Justification: An emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Development insofar as it is immediately necessary to enter into the Cooperative Agreement in order to allow the parties to close on the bond issuance within 30 days thereby allowing the bond proceeds to be instantly deposited with the City for the purpose of allowing the prompt submission of subsequent legislation to authorize the construction contract for the public infrastructure improvements at Doherty Road and West Broad Street, which any delay in proceeding with construction may cause the bid amount of the public project to increase or be null.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: No funding is required for this legislation. WHEREAS, the Rezoning Ordinance further requires the Developer to complete certain public infrastructure improvements to Doherty Road and West Broad Street (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, consistent with the *Big Darby Accord Watershed Master Plan* (2006), the Private Improvements Site is subject to the establishment of certain public financing tools pursuant to the revenue program established by Resolution No. 0216X-2008; and

WHEREAS, City Council, by its Ordinance No. 2535-2020, authorized the City and the Developer to enter the Big Darby - Crown Pointe Development Agreement dated December 1, 2020 to outline the establishment of tax increment financing, a new community authority, and a developer contribution to be used to reimburse obligations issued for the Project; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2990-2021 (the "TIF Ordinance"), City Council created a tax increment financing area pursuant to R.C. Sections 5709.40(B), 5709.42, and 5709.43 whereby the City exempted the Private Improvements on the Private Improvements Site (the "West Broad Street TIF") and required service payments in lieu of taxes to be made on the Private Improvements (the "Pledged Service Payments"); and

BACKGROUND: The City's Department of Public Service ("DPS") is performing the Signals - Dering Avenue at South High Street Project (Project Number 545013-100000) ("Public Project"). The City must acquire certain fee simple title and lesser real estate located at the intersection of South High Street and Dering Avenue (collectively, "Real Estate") in order for DPS to timely complete the Public Project. The City passed Ordinance Numbers 3029-2018 and 0531-2022 authorizing the City Attorney to acquire the Real Estate.

Furthermore, the City also adopted Resolution 0163X-2024 establishing the City's intent to appropriate the Real Estate. The City's acquisition of the Real Estate will help make, improve, or repair certain portions of the public right-of-way located at the intersection of South High Street and Dering Avenue which will be open to the public without charge.

The City Attorney, pursuant to Columbus City Code, Section 909.03, served notice to all of the owners of the Real Estate of the (i) Public Project's public purpose and necessity, and (ii) adoption of Resolution 0163X-2024. However, the City Attorney was unable to either locate some of the Real Estate's owner(s) or agree with some of the Real Estate's owner(s) in good faith regarding the amount of just compensation.

CONTRACT COMPLIANCE: Not applicable.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding to acquire the Real Estate is available through the Streets and Highways GO Bond Fund, Fund Number 7704 pursuant to existing Auditor's Certificate ACDI001231-10.

EMERGENCY JUSTIFICATION: Emergency action is requested in order to acquire the Real Estate which will allow DPS to timely complete the Public Project by December 2, 2024.

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend Section 2133.07 of the Columbus City Codes, pertaining to the prohibition of stunt driving and street takeovers, to correct a technical omission.

Following the post-COVID surge of street racing, stunt driving, and street takeovers throughout the country, creating dangerous activity on public streets, Columbus City Council enacted Ord. 2210-2024, which added a specific prohibition of stunt driving and street takeovers to Section 2133.07 of the Columbus City Codes. However, the version of this amendment that was passed omitted a definition for "Vehicle component," a term that was added to the Codes, but remained undefined in the Codes. This amendment will add the missing definition. No other amendments will be made to the existing language of Section 2133.07.

EMERGENCY DESIGNATION: This ordinance is presented as an emergency measure in order to allow for the timely enforcement and prosecution of any future charges brought for violations of Section 2133.07.

To amend section 2133.07 of the Columbus City Codes, pertaining to stunt driving and street takeovers and penalties for violations, to correct a technical error by including a definition for the term "vehicle component;" to repeal existing section 2133.07; and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Chapter 2133 of the Columbus City Codes pertains to provisions regarding the reckless operation of vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Section 2133.07 deals specifically to street racing prohibitions; and

WHEREAS, since the COVID pandemic, there has been a surge of street racing, stunt driving, and street takeovers throughout the country, creating dangerous activity on public streets; and

WHEREAS, Council passed Ordinance 2210-2024 in July 2024 to specifically prohibit stunt driving and street takeovers in the Columbus City Codes and add penalties for violations; and

WHEREAS, a definition for "vehicle component" was omitted in error from the original code amendment; and

WHEREAS, Council is proposing this additional amendment to correct the drafting error; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the normal operations of the City, in it is necessary to immediately make a technical correction to the Codes, to address this danger to public safety; **now, therefore**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

SECTION 1. That section 2133.07 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby amended, reading as follows:

- 2133.07 Street racing, stunt driving, and street takeover prohibited.
- (a) As used in this section:
- (1) "Street racing" means the operation of two (2) or more vehicles from a point side by side at accelerating speeds in a competitive attempt to out-distance each other or the operation of one or more vehicles over a common selected course, from the same point to the same point, wherein timing is made of the participating vehicles involving competitive accelerations or speeds. The operation of two (2) or more vehicles side by side either at speeds in excess of prima-facie lawful speeds established by Section 2133.03 or rapidly accelerating from a common starting point to a speed in excess of such prima-facie lawful speeds shall be prima-facie evidence of street racing.
- (2) "Burnout" means a maneuver performed while operating a vehicle whereby the vehicle is kept in a stationary position, but the wheels of the vehicle are spun, which may cause the tires of the vehicle to become heated and emit smoke from the friction.
- (3) "Doughnut" means a maneuver performed while operating a vehicle whereby the front or rear of the vehicle is rotated around the opposite set of wheels in a continuous motion, which may cause a circular skid-mark pattern of rubber on the driving surface, or the tires of the vehicle to become heated and emit smoke from the friction, or both.
- (4) "Drifting" means a maneuver performed while operating a vehicle whereby the vehicle is driven in a manner that causes a controlled, sideways skid during a turn, with the front wheels pointing in a direction that is the opposite of the direction of the turn.
- (5) "Wheelie" means a maneuver performed while operating a vehicle whereby the front wheel or wheels of the vehicle are raised off of the ground or whereby two wheels that are on the same side of the vehicle are raised off of the ground.
- (6) "Stunt driving" means performing or engaging in burnouts, doughnuts, drifting, or wheelies, causing vehicle tires to squeal, or allowing a passenger to ride either partially or fully outside of the vehicle while operating that vehicle.
- (7) "Street takeover" means blocking or impeding the regular flow of vehicle or pedestrian traffic on a public road, street, or highway or on private property that is open to the general public for the purpose of street racing or stunt driving.
- (8) "Instrumentality" has the same meaning as in section 2981.01 of the Revised Code.
- (9) "Vehicle Component" means any motor vehicle part or accessory specifically adapted for use in street racing, stunt driving, or street takeover. "Vehicle Component" includes, but is not limited to, steering wheels, wheels and tires, and mufflers.
- (b) No person shall knowingly participate in a street racing, stunt driving, or street takeover upon any public road, street, or highway or on private property that is open to the general public.
- (c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of street racing, stunt driving, or street takeover, a misdemeanor of the first degree. In addition to any other sanctions, the court shall suspend the offender's driver's license, commercial driver's license, temporary instruction permit, probationary license, or nonresident operating privilege for not less than thirty (30) days or more than three (3) years. No judge shall suspend the first thirty (30) days of any suspension of an offender's license, permit, or privilege imposed under this division.
- (d) In addition to any other penalties imposed by law, a vehicle component used in a violation of division (b) of this section is an instrumentality, shall be subject to seizure as contraband, and is subject to forfeiture under Chapter 2981 of the Revised Code.
- (e) Persons rendering assistance in any manner to street racing, stunt driving, or street takeover shall be equally charged as the participants.

(f) This section does not apply to the competitive operation of vehicles on public or private property in accordance with a Special Event permit issued pursuant to Chapter 923 or when otherwise authorized by ordinance of Council.

SECTION 2. That existing section 2133.07 of the Columbus City Codes is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor or 10 days after its passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

Latino businesses represent a significant growth opportunity for central Ohio. Over the last ten years, the number of Latino businesses owners has grown by 44%, compared to 4% for all other business owners. Within Columbus, the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce reports that there are 16,000 Hispanic-owned businesses. However, Columbus ranks below the national average in terms of its share of very small businesses (fewer than 20 employees) and representation of Hispanic-owned businesses.

¡Festival Latino! and the Hispanic Heritage festival are two prime opportunities for launching Hispanic businesses. However, in past years many of the food vendors at ¡Festival Latino! were from out of state. A primary reason for low local participation in the festival was unfamiliarity with the requirements of becoming a vendor. There is an opportunity to build capacity in greater Columbus and assist Latinos in creating businesses.

In recent years, the Ohio Small Business Development Center at Columbus State has provided a series of workshops prior to ¡Festival Latino! to help Hispanic entrepreneurs prepare for the event. The goal of this program, called Mercadito Raices ("The Roots Market"), is to demonstrate to Latino businesses the value of community outreach by assisting them through all the steps needed to prepare and have successful sales in community events and open the doors to a wider market.

In 2023, the Ohio Small Business Development Center partnered with Catholic Social Services' Our Lady of Guadalupe Center (OLGC) to offer Mercadito Raices, in conjunction with both ¡Festival Latino! and the Hispanic Heritage festival. Ten Hispanic entrepreneurs completed the Mercadito Raices workshops in 2023, nine of whom launched their businesses at ¡Festival Latino! on August 12-13, 2023.

Catholic Social Services is requesting support from the City of Columbus to continue and expand the Mercadito Raices initiative to aspiring Hispanic entrepreneurs in 2024.

More broadly, Mercadito Raices will:

- * Demonstrate the diversity of the Latino community with food and merchandise vendors, as well as entrepreneurs providing services or starting online businesses.
- * Promote the talented businesses available in our local community.
- * Keep the money spent locally at the festivals in Central Ohio.

Fiscal Impact: Funding is available within the Job Growth subfund.



WHEREAS, the staff of Columbus Public Health has traditionally provided licenses and conducted inspections for all food service operations and retail food establishments within the City of Columbus; and,

To amend §251.03 of the Columbus City Health Code in regard to the food service operation and retail food establishment fees in accordance with The State of Ohio Uniform Food Safety Code, law and rules.

WHEREAS, the staff of Columbus Public Health has traditionally provided licenses and conducted inspections for all food service operations and retail food establishments within the City of Columbus; and,

WHEREAS, the staff of Columbus Public Health has completed the cost analysis calculations required by Ohio Revised Code §3717.07 Uniform Cost Methodologies; Ohio Administrative Code, Cost Analysis and Calculations §3701-21-02.2; Cost Analysis and License Fee Calculation §901:3-4-04; and,

WHEREAS, the staff of Columbus Public Health recommend the following food service operation and retail food establishment fees for licenses, facility layout & equipment specification review, and expedited plan review to recover current costs of the food protection program; and,

WHEREAS, the code establishes a new fee structure and cost methodology for establishing fees which is to go into effect on December 1, 2024; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:

Section 1. That licensing fees established by the state methodology be adopted by the Columbus Board of Health.

<u>Section 2</u>. That §251.03 of the Columbus City Health Code, Approval of Plans; Fees, be amended to read as follows:
