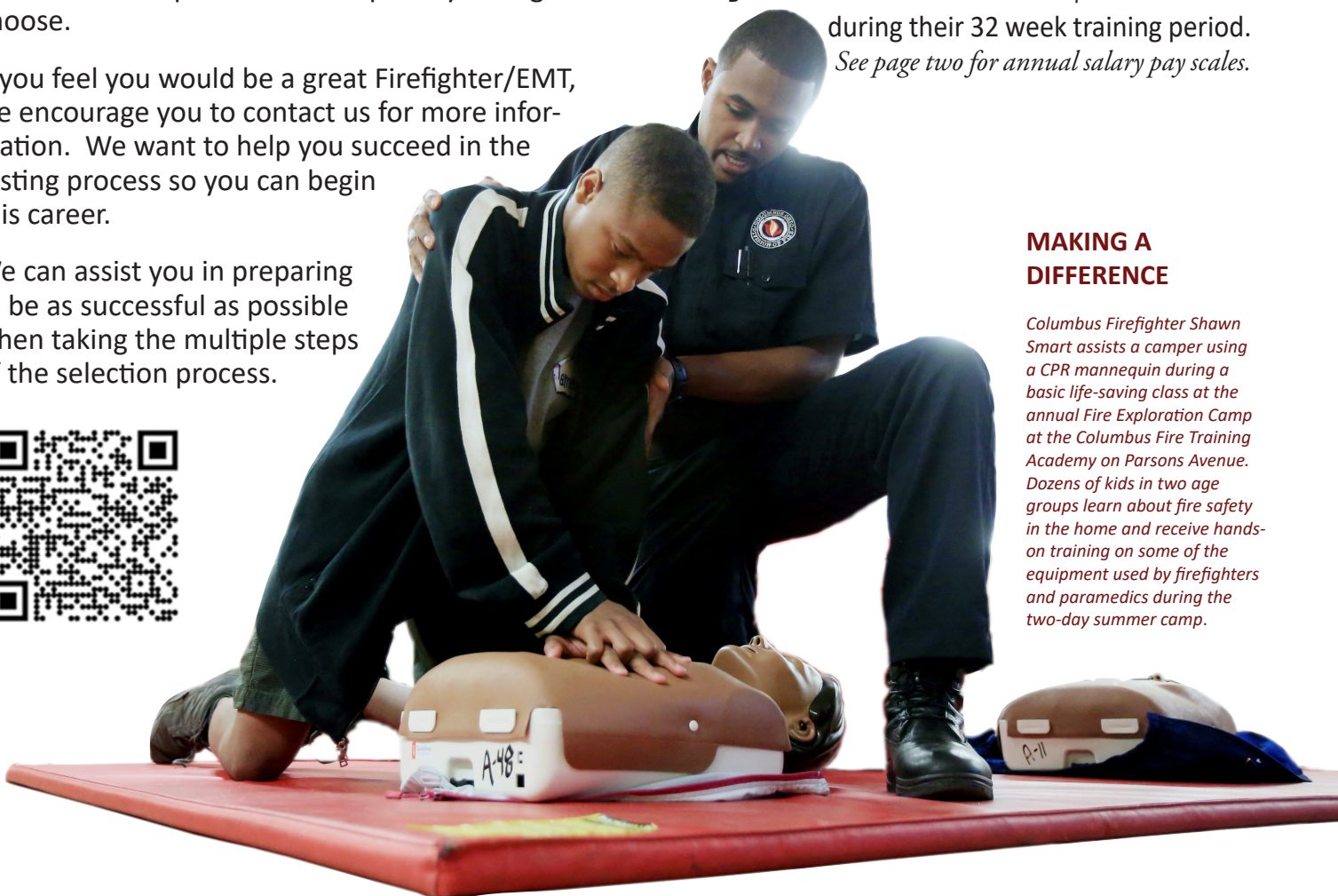

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Dozens of kids in two age groups learn about fire safety in the home and receive hands-on training on some of the equipment used by firefighters and paramedics during the two-day summer camp.



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The Columbus Division of Fire is a nationally accredited public safety agency which employs over 1,600 uniform firefighters. Columbus is the 14th largest fire department serving a diverse metropolitan community of nearly 1 million people. The Division of Fire responds to over 200,000 calls for emergency services every year.

Division hiring occurs on an annual cycle. It is our goal to continually seek highly qualified men and women of diverse backgrounds to become candidates to join our family.

The Columbus Division of Fire offers Firefighter-EMTs an attractive salary and benefit package determined by a collective bargaining contract between the City of Columbus and the Columbus Firefighters IAFF Union Local 67. Members earn step increases annually after a year of continuous service.

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Minimum Requirements

- At least 17 1/2 years of age at the time of application and 18 years old at time of hire
- Valid driver's license at time of application and valid **Ohio driver's** license at time of hire
- U.S. citizen at time of application
- High School Diploma or GED at time of appointment

Testing Components

Written Examination Series of multiple choice questions concentrating on information gathering, mathematics, logic & reasoning, mechanical aptitude, map reading and reading comprehension. This exam is a Pass or Fail.

FOAM Firefighter Oral Assessment Mechanism is a video-based test that examines a candidate's problem resolution skills and interpersonal relations skills. Those who pass this phase will be placed on a Civil Service Eligible list in score order.

Firefighter Mile Physical Testing Physical Fitness Test course. This is a Pass or Fail Test.
